Message From Our Chairman

Dear Best Buddies Family,

As we reflect on 2024, I am filled with immense pride and gratitude for the incredible progress we've made together in building a more inclusive world for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). This year marked a major turning point for our organization, as we deepened our impact, expanded our reach, and launched powerful new initiatives that will transform the lives of countless individuals and families for years to come.

One of the most significant and impactful initiatives of 2024 was the introduction of Best Buddies Family Support, our fifth mission pillar. This program is designed to provide families raising children with IDD access to mentors and meaningful connections, critical resources, and a strong community of support. To officially announce this launch, I had the honor of joining Best Buddies Global Ambassador and Today Show host Savannah Guthrie for a live interview on NBC in May. Together, we introduced the world to Eunie's Buddies, our new initiative supporting families and caregivers and I could not be prouder of what this represents for the future of inclusion.

This year also brought extraordinary momentum from our corporate partners, whose generosity and commitment to our mission elevated our work on every level. Best Buddies and the global iconic brand The Coca-Cola Company entered a five-year partnership, with the company becoming the "Official Beverage Partner" of Best Buddies through its BODYARMOR and Coca-Cola brands. Their \$1 million grant will allow us to grow our supported employment program and place participants with IDD in meaningful jobs.

Our partnership with Jersey Mike's Subs also reached new heights. In just two days, their nationwide campaign raised \$5.3 million to benefit Best Buddies! Their continued investment in inclusive hiring supports our work toward an ambitious goal: 3,000 job placements for individuals with IDD over the next 5 to 7 years.

Thanks to your support, 2024 has proven what is possible when community, commitment, and compassion come together. We are not only changing lives, we are building a sustainable movement of inclusion that empowers people with IDD to thrive.

To our participants, families, staff, donors, and volunteers: thank you for your belief in this mission and for walking alongside us. We know there is still more work to do but with your continued support, we are rising to meet the moment.

Together, we are shaping a world where everyone is seen, valued, and included.

Why We Matter

Society has made undeniable progress in improving the lives of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Yet, we still have a long way to go. Many people with IDD remain unemployed and do not experience the simple joys of genuine friendships and a significant portion of the IDD community still faces access barriers, pervasive social isolation, and discrimination.

This is where Best Buddies International plays a vital role as a model of inclusion and catalyst for change. Best Buddies is the world's largest organization committed to ending the social, physical and economic isolation that 200 million individuals with IDD often experience. For those within the IDD community, Best Buddies represents a pathway to forging lifelong friendships, securing gainful employment, achieving independent living and gaining the skills and confidence to advocate for themselves.

An estimated 84%* of adults (18+) with IDD do not have a paid job in the community. This is where the Best Buddies' Jobs program steps in. The Best Buddies Jobs program has participants employed full time who each have the potential to earn a total income upwards of \$1mm over 30 years and contribute \$250k in taxes back into the economy, rather than costing the government approximately \$750k each in Federal SSI and Medicaid support during that time period.

This is just one of the countless ways Best Buddies improves the lives of individuals with IDD while simultaneously improving whole-of-society outcomes. Through the cultivation of meaningful one-on-one friendships, the pursuit of integrated employment, the provision of inclusive living arrangements and the nurturing of leadership skills, Best Buddies is fostering a world that is full of opportunity for individuals with IDD.

A Parent's Perspective

Mitch Holeve is a mentor in our new Eunie's Buddies program which offers families the support and resources needed to navigate the journey of raising a child with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Recently, Mitch was paired with Brent, a new dad just starting out on this journey. The two fathers and their sons, Garrett and Kai, had the chance to meet in person at MOD Pizza, where Garrett works in a job he proudly secured through the Best Buddies Jobs program.

"Supporting new fathers has been one of the most rewarding and humbling experiences I've had. I know from experience that the early days can be overwhelming and filled with uncertainty, questions, and emotions that you really did not expect. I also know that no dad should have to go through that journey alone, like I did 35 years ago with my son Garrett. Supporting new dads is not about me having the right answers; it's about offering empathy, encouragement, and connection during a time that can be a bit tough, and they may feel alone.

Every father deserves to feel supported, and every child deserves to have a father who feels supported—so that dad can do a great job.

As a father, having three grown sons has brought me the most joy. It is wonderful to see each one become his own man and contribute to society in a meaningful way. Watching them grow and enjoy their lives has been incredibly fulfilling.

In my view, individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities bring their unique abilities and personalities to the world, each in their own way.

Becoming a mentor in the Eunie's Buddies program brings immense joy by allowing me to support another parent. I hope to share our family's unique and everyday experiences of raising Garrett. By sharing these experiences, we hope others will gain a little knowledge and a lot of optimism for their child's future. We also want them to know that their path, compared to ours, offers plenty of support and opportunities for their child to learn and grow."

2024 Highlights

Launches

- In 2024, Best Buddies launches its fifth mission pillar BESTBUDDIES® Family Support, to offer families access to individual connections and community resources that assist them on their journey of raising a child with intellectual and developmental disabilities.
- On May 21, Anthony K. Shriver, Founder, Chairman, and CEO of Best Buddies International, appeared on NBC's Today Show in New York City for an exclusive interview with Best Buddies Global Ambassador and Today Show host Savannah Guthrie. They discussed the impact of Best Buddies' mission to foster inclusion for the IDD community and officially announced the launch of Eunie's Buddies, the organization's new initiative supporting families raising children with intellectual and developmental disabilities

New Partnerships

- **The Coca-Cola Company** amplified their BODYARMOR hydration sponsorship with a more comprehensive 5-year partnership that encompassed soft drinks and made them the "Official Beverage Partner" of Best Buddies. Coca-Cola soft drink products and branding were featured across Best Buddies Challenges, Breakaway Camps, and the Miami Gala. Additionally, they announced a \$1MM grant to expand Best Buddies' supported employment program, providing job opportunities for participants with IDD during FIFA World Cup activations.
- **Jersey Mike's Subs** launched a 2-day campaign donating 20% of nationwide sales to Best Buddies, raising \$5.3MM overall. In its second year of partnership, the brand continued to advance inclusive hiring initiatives through the Best Buddies Jobs program, aiming for 3,000 placements in 5-7 years.
- **Miracle Recreation** committed to developing Best Buddies commercial playgrounds and Buddy Benches, designed to provide a new standard of best-in-class inclusive and accessible playground equipment for all ages and abilities.
- **Shutterfly** partnered with Best Buddies to highlight the magic of the Friendship Walk through a national photo scavenger hunt, encouraging participants to capture authentic moments of connection. Winning photos and Leadership Conference videos were shared on social media on July 30 to celebrate International Friendship Day
- **Sky Zone** welcomed Best Buddies as a national "Do-Good Partner", committing to host a series of private "Friendship Tuesday" events exclusively for program participants at 6 trampoline park locations annually. BOGO coupons were also furnished for national Best Buddies distribution, so that program participants across the country could enjoy their local park with peers at their convenience.

Milestones

1987 - 1996

- In 1987, Anthony Kennedy Shriver launches **BESTBUDDIES®** Colleges by founding the first Best Buddies chapter at Georgetown University.
- In 1988, the iconic Best Buddies logo was donated to Best Buddies by legendary pop-artist, Keith Haring.
- On January 19, 1989, Best Buddies is incorporated as a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, becoming America's first national, unified, social and recreational program for people with IDD.
- In 1992, Best Buddies Global Headquarters office moves to Miami, FL.
- In 1993, Best Buddies launches **BESTBUDDIES®** Citizens to pair adults with IDD in one-to-one friendships with their working peers who do not have disabilities.
- In 1994, Best Buddies launches **BESTBUDDIES®** Jobs, a supported employment program targeting high-paying, corporate jobs for people with IDD.
- In 1995, Best Buddies launches **BESTBUDDIES®** High Schools to pair special education students in one-to-one friendships with high school volunteers.
- In 1996, Best Buddies launches **BESTBUDDIES®** Middle Schools to pair students with IDD in one-to-one friendships with middle school volunteers.

1999 - 2011

- In 1998, Best Buddies hosts the first *Best Buddies Miami Gala*.
- In 1999, Best Buddies launches **e-BUDDIES®**, a cutting-edge online friendship program.
- In 2000, Best Buddies holds the inaugural *Best Buddies Challenge: Hyannis Port*, a 100-mile bike ride from Boston to Hyannis Port.
- In 2003, Best Buddies has participants in all 50 states on the US.
- In 2004, Best Buddies launches the nationally televised inaugural *Volvo Best Buddies Challenge: Hearst Castle*, a 100-mile bike ride along the Pacific Coast Highway.
- In 2009, Best Buddies launches *Best Buddies Friendship Walk*.
- In 2010, Best Buddies has programs in 50 countries around the world.
- In 2011, Best Buddies launches **BESTBUDDIES®** Ambassadors to teach participants with IDD communication and self-advocacy skills.

2012 - 2019

- In 2012, Best Buddies launches **BESTBUDDIES®** Promoters, the first Best Buddies program open to elementary schools; the inaugural of the *Best Buddies Challenge: Miami* takes place and the first *Best Buddies Champion of The Year Gala* is hosted.
- In 2014, Best Buddies celebrates its 25th anniversary and also celebrates 25 years of the *Best Buddies Leadership Conference*.
- In 2017, Best Buddies holds the first *Best Buddies Breakaway Camp: Malibu* and hosts the inaugural *Best Buddies' Celebrating Mothers* in Malibu, CA, with Global Ambassador Cindy Crawford and her daughter, Kaia Gerber.
- In 2019, Best Buddies launches its fourth mission pillar, **BESTBUDDIES®** Inclusive Living, to provide individuals with and without IDD an opportunity to live independently in a dynamic environment where they can learn, grow and thrive.

2020 - Current

- In 2020, Best Buddies introduces **BESTBUDDIES®** Ventures, with the first launch being **BESTBUDDIES®** X Rosetta Bakery in Miami, FL, creates jobs for individuals with IDD and operates as a profit center via a bakery and coffee shop partnership.
- In 2020, Best Buddies launches **BESTBUDDIES®** Transitions to help prepare young adults with IDD for independence and inclusion in their communities as they move from school into adulthood.
- In 2022, Best Buddies launches **BESTBUDDIES®** Elementary Schools to teach inclusion to a younger age group to create a lasting effect on societal norms for the next generation. In 2023, as part of the organization's 2030 Initiative to impact 4 million people globally, Best Buddies continues to partner with Global Ambassadors such as Tom Brady and Cindy Crawford to further expand its mission of inclusion and the 5-star **BESTBUDDIES®** X Rosetta Bakery.
- In 2024, Best Buddies launches its fifth mission pillar **BESTBUDDIES®** Family Support, to offer families access to individual connections and community resources that assist them on their journey of raising a child with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

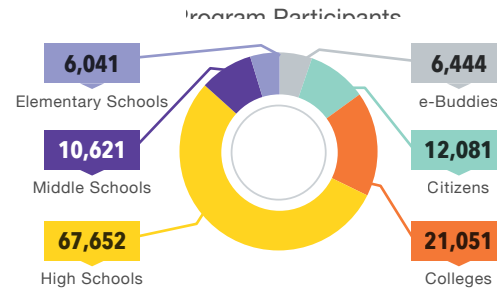

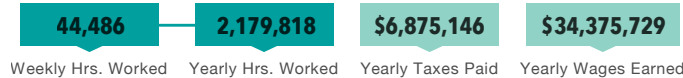

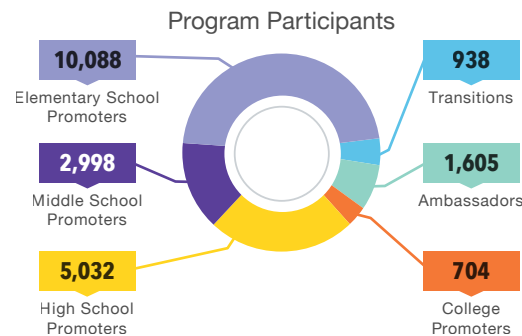

We are BESTBUDDIES®

Best Buddies is the largest organization dedicated to ending the social, physical, and economic isolation of the 200 million people worldwide with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Our programs empower people with IDD to form meaningful friendships with their peers, secure jobs, improve communication and advocacy skills, and live independently, while also offering support for their families.

Mission

Best Buddies International is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to establishing a global volunteer movement that creates opportunities for one-to-one friendships, integrated employment, leadership development, inclusive living, and family support for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).

Who We Serve

Best Buddies serves individuals with IDD and their families. The IDD community includes, but is not limited to, people with Down syndrome, autism, Fragile X, Williams syndrome, and other undiagnosed disabilities.

Programs

Best Buddies programs sit on the five key mission pillars below:

One-To-One Friendships

Builds friendships between people with and without IDD, offering social mentoring while improving the quality of life and level of inclusion for a population that is often isolated and excluded.

BESTBUDDIES® Elementary Schools, Middle Schools, High Schools, Colleges, & Citizens

Creates an inclusive community for students and adults with IDD, helping them become socially integrated with their peers at every age.

e-BUDDIES®

Provides opportunities for participants with and without IDD to form virtual one-to-one friendships, create connections in the e-Buddies social platform, and attend social events online.

Integrated Employment

Secures jobs for people with IDD, empowering them to earn an income, pay taxes, and independently support themselves through their professional accomplishments.

BESTBUDDIES® Jobs

Matches skilled, qualified individuals with IDD with businesses seeking enthusiastic and dedicated employees. Through the Jobs program, Best Buddies develops partnerships with employers, assists with the hiring process and provides ongoing support to the employee and employer.

Leadership Development

Educates and empowers people with and without IDD to become leaders, public speakers, and advocates.

BESTBUDDIES® Ambassadors

Offers people with and without IDD the opportunity to gain the public speaking skills, self-esteem, and confidence needed to successfully advocate for themselves, their peers, and Best Buddies in communities and workplaces.

BESTBUDDIES® Promoters

Empowers youth to become advocates for people with IDD and helps chapters organize special events that promote inclusion and bring awareness to the disability rights movement.

BESTBUDDIES® Transitions

Offers a combination of classroom-based training, experiential learning, and corporate mentorship to help students with IDD explore post-secondary options, prepare for independent living, and identify career ambitions.

Inclusive Living

Provides an integrated experience in which people with and without IDD are active, contributing citizens – living independently in a dynamic environment where they can learn, grow, and thrive.

BESTBUDDIES® Living

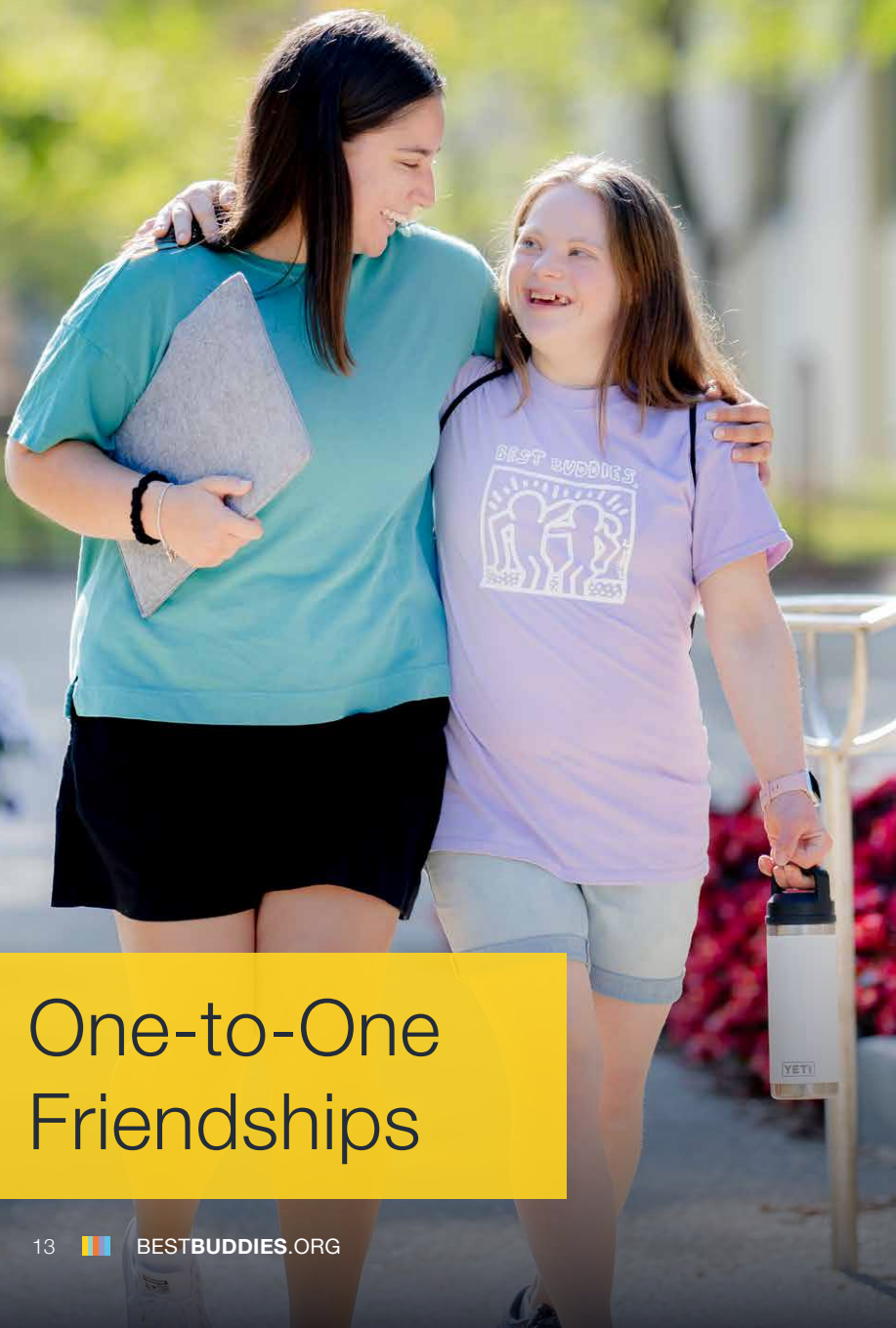
Offers individuals with and without IDD an opportunity to live together in a vibrant, educational community that supports all residents in advancing their employment, financial literacy, continued education, and life skills as they work to achieve their personal goals.

Family Support

Provides families access to individual connections and community resources that assist them on their journey of supporting a family member with IDD.

Eunie's **BUDDIES**®

Connects families who are expecting or have a young child with IDD to experienced parents of a child with IDD, encouraging a genuine relationship rooted in mentorship, resource-sharing, and guidance.



One-to-One Friendships

Without love, support, and friends, life may feel isolating – this is a reality people with IDD have faced throughout history. Best Buddies offers people with IDD the chance to have a friend, gain self-confidence and self-esteem and share interests, experiences, and activities that many other individuals enjoy.

BESTBUDDIES. Elementary Schools, Middle Schools, High Schools & Colleges

Best Buddies offers students with IDD the opportunity to have a friend and enjoy common interests, experiences, and social activities in the Middle School, High School, and College programs. Each friendship pair commits to speaking and spending time together every week throughout the year. These programs create lasting friendships and help facilitate an environment of inclusion throughout the school and in the community.

BESTBUDDIES. Citizens

For people with IDD, the absence of meaningful friendships extends into adulthood. Best Buddies Citizens pairs adults with IDD in one-to-one friendships with adults without IDD in corporate and civic communities. Citizen buddy pairs commit to a one-year friendship in which they will talk once a week and see each other twice a month. These relationships commonly grow into friendships that last a lifetime.

e-BUDDIES.

This program creates social inclusion and friendships for people with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) in a virtual space. Technology is an integral part of society and by participating in e-Buddies, participants can develop the skills needed to communicate across a variety of platforms.

For the past three years, the halls of Souhegan High School have been brightened by the presence of one extraordinary friendship. Emma and Harrell, now seniors, met when they were first-year Sabres at the school in Amherst and were matched in the Best Buddies program. Being matched in a one-to-one friendship has enhanced the high school experience for both Emma and Harrell. Emma explains that while many high schoolers worry about the opinions of their peers and whether they are “popular,” she feels that the bond she has with Harrell is more than enough to make her feel like she belongs.


Harrell lists off some fun things he and Emma have done together, including foosball, Candyland, popcorn with movies, petting horses, and bracelet making. His learning specialist, Katie, describes that Harrell’s communication skills and confidence have both blossomed as a result of being part of Best Buddies and having a friend like Emma to bond with. He is more apt to seek out close friendships now that he has experienced such a meaningful one with Emma for the past three years.

Emma and Harrell have had a lasting impact on their school’s chapter, constantly bringing their energy and positivity to meetings, from dance parties to unified basketball games. Emma tells Harrell, “You’re the reason I’m sad to leave high school!” Harrell reinforces those feelings calling Emma his best friend and encouraging individuals in New Hampshire and beyond to “join Best Buddies!”

Integrated Employment

Best Buddies Jobs assists participants in finding meaningful employment, earning a competitive income, receiving benefits, and working alongside others in the community. The program offers people with IDD the opportunity to become financially independent, removing the need for government assistance or parental support. A focus on competitive, professional opportunities is what sets the Best Buddies Jobs program apart from other employment services.

BESTBUDDIES. Jobs

Best Buddies Jobs furthers the integration of people with IDD into the community through supported employment. The focus is on facilitating competitive, integrated job placements that allow participants to earn an income, pay taxes, and work in an environment alongside their peers in the community, leading to full inclusion and independence. Coaching is provided in essential job interviewing skills, and once employment is secured, there is assistance with on-the-job training.

The Jobs program prides itself on developing employment opportunities in professional environments and focuses on white-collar jobs such as receptionists, mail room assistants, file clerks, office assistants, front desk assistants, and retail associates. Employers range from some of the top law firms and talent agencies to well-known retail businesses and luxury hotels.

Jeet Dave was diagnosed with Autism during his school years and was placed under a partial IEP program. Before becoming involved with Best Buddies, he began pursuing an associate degree in Accounting at Oakton Community College with support from the IEP program. During this time, he experienced feelings of insecurity and concern about securing a job in accounting. It was around this period that he was introduced to Best Buddies through Ms. Eileen Morrison.

In his final year of college, Jeet started working with Best Buddies to find a job in accounting. Initially, Best Buddies connected him with a position as a merchandise associate at a large retailer. He continued working with the organization to achieve his long-term goal of securing an accounting role. Simultaneously, he found an office assistant job at the office of a family friend. Recognizing the importance of stability, he decided to pursue a full-time office position that could support his disabilities and offer future career growth.

“Best Buddies worked hard to find me a job and provided accommodations throughout the hiring process in support of my disabilities,” said Jeet. “My life improved, not only economically but mentally and socially.”

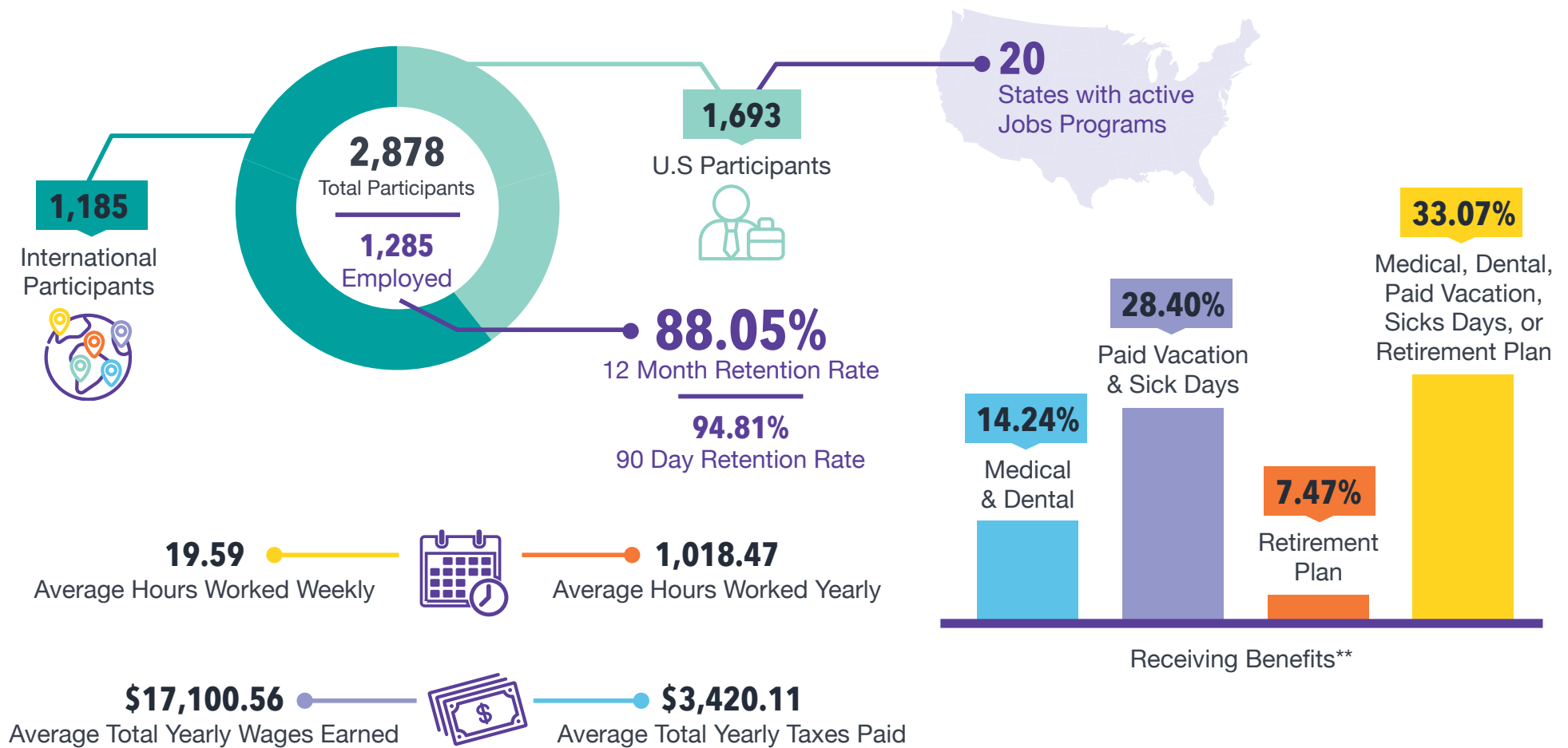
Ultimately, Jeet was hired at Ally Financial with the assistance of Best Buddies and over two years of office work experience.

“The part I love most about my job is that my colleagues are very nice, friendly, and cooperative,” said Jeet. “I feel secure and safe in my work environment and, my job gives me opportunities to be social and continue advancing my professional skills.”

With a stable job and a steady income, Jeet has taken on personal financial responsibilities, including credit card payments and other necessary expenses. Looking ahead, he envisions getting married and starting a family.

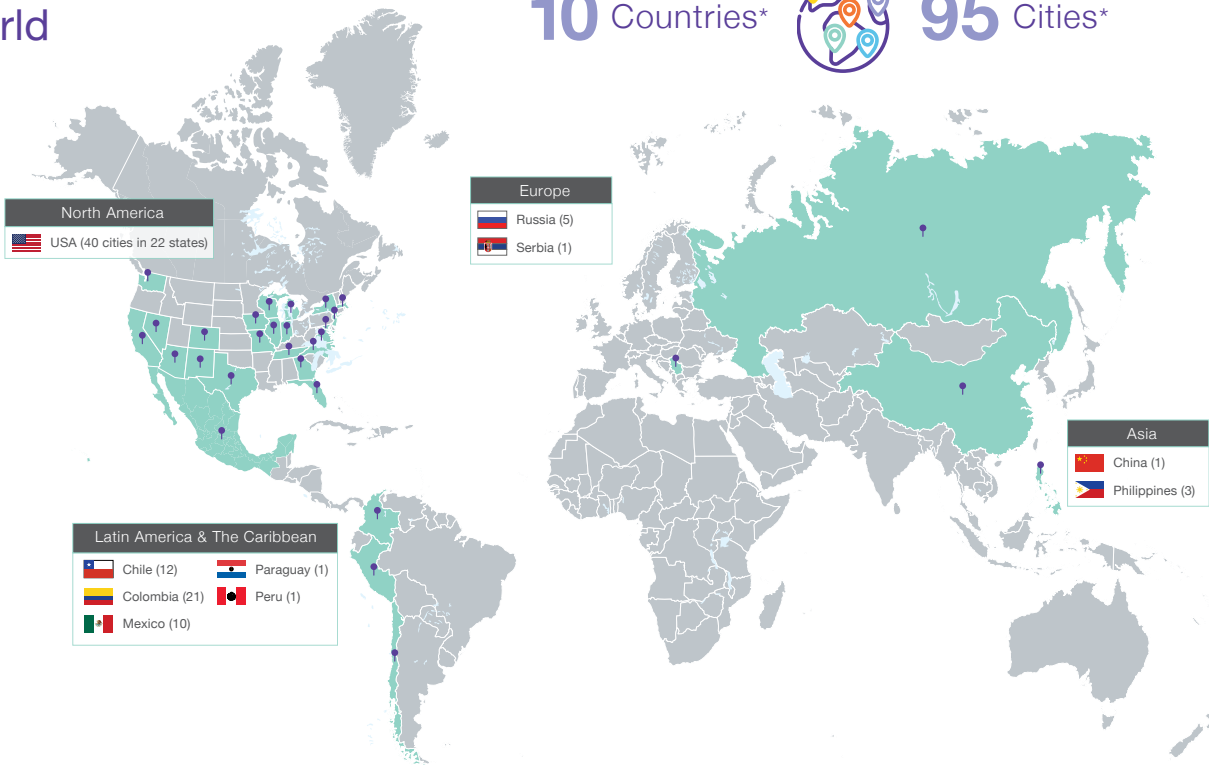

Leadership Development

Best Buddies educates and empowers people with and without IDD to become leaders, public speakers and change agents. Through the Ambassadors and Promoters programs, participants inspire their communities to build a more inclusive world for people with IDD.

BESTBUDDIES® Ambassadors

Best Buddies Ambassadors is a program that provides training for participants with and without IDD in speech writing, public speaking, and self-advocacy. Ambassadors develop the skills to share their life stories, promote Best Buddies programs, network, and, most importantly, advocate.

Ambassadors participate in trainings focused on the art of public speaking and advocacy. Once trained, they share their stories and become more involved and empowered as citizens. Ambassadors are encouraged to speak about opportunities for people with IDD, present at recruitment fairs and Best Buddies events, and develop partnerships in the community.

BESTBUDDIES® Promoters

Best Buddies Promoters empowers youth to become advocates for people with IDD by organizing and attending special events that promote inclusion. Students attending a school without a special education program can join a Promoters chapter to develop connections with people with IDD or can start one by contacting their local Best Buddies state office.

Each Promoters chapter is led by a chapter president from the student body and a faculty advisor and is assigned a Best Buddies staff person who offers regular support and guidance. Once formed, Promoters chapters host events, activities, and fundraisers where they advocate for people with IDD, and promote the Best Buddies mission.

My name is Kiontis Gallion, also known as Kid Autistic, and I am proud to call the great state of Wisconsin my home. My journey began at West Allis Central High School, where I faced many challenges—loneliness, bullying, and a search for belonging. For a long time, I struggled to see my own worth.

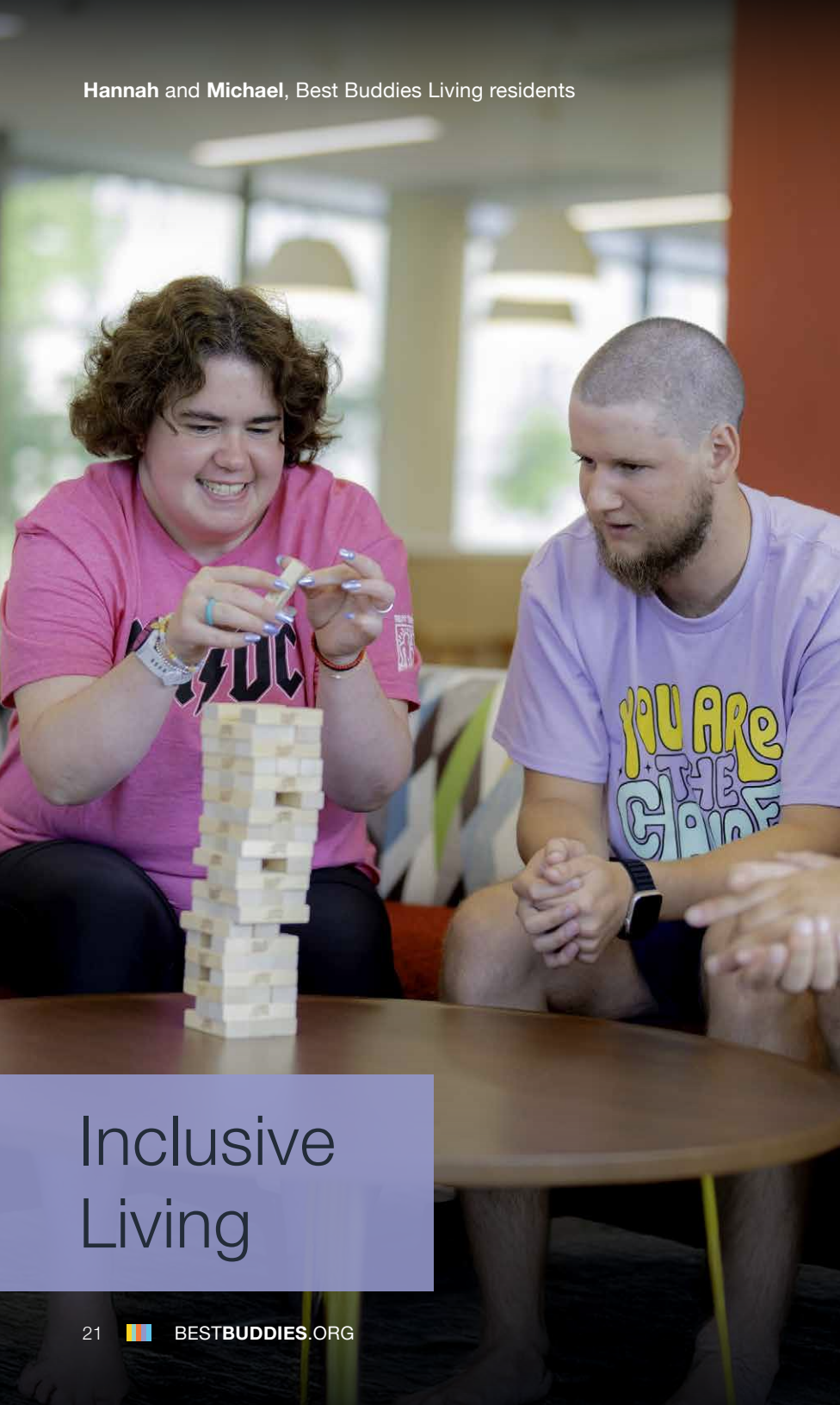
But then, something remarkable happened. A teacher saw in me what I couldn't yet see in myself—my potential to help others. She encouraged me to step outside my comfort zone and join Best Buddies, an organization dedicated to fostering inclusion and friendship. That decision changed everything. The unexpected happened: I became the chapter president. This role gave me a sense of purpose, expanded my circle of friends, and helped me realize something profound—my autism is not a disability but a special ability.

At the end of the day, real change begins with our mindset. As Michael Jackson once said, "If you want to make the world a better place, take a look at yourself and make that change." Change is not about waiting for the perfect moment—it's about taking action now.

Anthony Shiver reminds us that we are not defined by limitations but by our strengths. Every person in this world has a unique gift, a talent meant to be shared. We don't need magic to make a difference; we only need the courage to be ourselves. So why wait to be a leader? Why wait to step into your greatness? No matter how many obstacles stand in your way, know what you want and go after it. We are the world. We are the children. We are the ones who can make a brighter day, so let's start giving.

Never give up on your dreams just because someone says you can't achieve them. You have an incredible gift—let it shine. Stars don't shine because they seek attention; they shine because that's simply what they are meant to do. The same is true for you. You have the power to use your voice, to inspire, to motivate, and to create change. The more you believe in your dreams, the more they will become reality. Because bold is beautiful—and bold is you. You are a champion in your own domain, capable of making a lasting impact in this world.

BESTBUDDIES[®] Living

The Best Buddies Living program encourages people with and without IDD to live together in a vibrant community that focuses on supporting residents in accomplishing their life goals and dreams.

The Best Buddies Living program supports inclusion by:

- Developing programs that foster an opportunity for residents to experience living with friends and colleagues. Programs include weekly shared meals, fitness classes, cultural events, holiday parties, social activities, and sports.
- Offering an environment that encourages the development of independent living skills, life-changing relationships, and educational pursuits in connection with a college or university. Through an affiliation with a nearby school, all residents can immerse themselves in campus life, attending sporting events and enjoying fitness and dining facilities alongside their student peers.
- Matching people with and without IDD in a residential experience, and providing a supportive environment that encourages full-time or part-time employment.

Best Buddies Living Resident Los Angeles, CA

For Yvenie Joseph, becoming a resident of Best Buddies Living in Los Angeles has been truly life-changing. Before joining the program in January 2024, she faced immense challenges—moving from place to place without family support, struggling with her mental health, and ultimately living in a homeless shelter. She longed for stability, independence, and a place to call home. Best Buddies Living provided her with exactly that and more. Now, for the first time in her life, she has her own room, a steady job, and a supportive community that empowers her to thrive.


“I joined the program in January, and before Best Buddies, my life was a rollercoaster,” Yvenie shares. “I was living in a homeless shelter, struggling with my mental health, and constantly moving with no family support.”

“Best Buddies gave me a stable place to live and helped me get back on my feet. This is the first time I’ve ever had my own room. Now, I have a stable job and understand the responsibilities of being an adult. I’ve learned how to be responsible and make sure my bills are paid. I’ve learned how to budget and save money.”

One of Yvenie’s favorite aspects of Best Buddies Living is the weekly group dinners, where residents come together to share meals and connect. “There are so many different personalities, and at first, I was nervous to talk. But over time, I’ve learned to embrace everyone,” she says. “I also feel a sense of peace at home with my roommates. The weekly meetings and group dinners encourage personal growth and provide a strong support system.”

For others with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), Yvenie hopes to inspire confidence and self-acceptance. “I want people with IDD to surround themselves with those who understand their disabilities. You shouldn’t feel bad because of your disability—you can still achieve all your goals and dreams.”

Family Support

Best Buddies Family Support offers families the support and resources needed to navigate the journey of raising a child with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).

Eunie's **BUDDIES**.

Eunie's Buddies serves as the pioneering program within the Family Support initiative. It is named affectionately in honor of Eunice Kennedy Shriver, founder of Special Olympics and a true hero who advocated tirelessly for positive change in the lives of individuals with IDD.

Eunie's Buddies pairs experienced parents of a child with an IDD with new parents who are expecting, have just welcomed a baby, or are raising a child up to the age of eight years old who has been recently diagnosed with an IDD. This pairing creates a mentor-mentee connection and friendship. Eunie's Buddies provides a framework offering parents and caregivers encouragement, emotional support, and valuable resources. Participation in Eunie's Buddies helps families pave the way for a child with IDD to have an education, gainful employment, and a fulfilled life.

International Programs

In 2024, the newly formed International Programs and Incubator Teams set out to strengthen global Best Buddies operations through expanded funding opportunities, strategic guidance, social media support, and training. Their primary goal was to deepen the impact of country programs by aligning efforts and resources, especially in areas of employment programming, operational development, and donor engagement.

Over the year, the team made significant strides. On the funding front, they secured major U.S. State Department grants—\$100,000 for Korea and \$250,000 for Russia—and began cultivating direct relationships with the State Department beyond the formal application process. Corporate partnerships with JLL and Colgate-Palmolive remained strong, while new global funding conversations were initiated with the MAPFRE Foundation. Expansion plans for the Middle East were solidified with new funding secured to launch Best Buddies UAE in 2025.

Strategically, the team developed a revised Intellectual Property (IP) Strategic Plan to guide countries by development stage, and created a business plan template to help countries explore launching Best Buddies Jobs. Operationally, they introduced new IP systems, enhanced alignment through quarterly team meetings, and worked closely with the Incubator Team to support growing programs. They also contributed to key events, including the Best Buddies Board of Directors meeting in Madrid and thought leadership engagements with IAAPA and Colgate.

In 2024, the Jobs program continued to operate actively in Brazil, Chile, and Colombia.

Looking ahead, 2025 will mark a new chapter as the International Programs and Incubator Teams merge to form the International Programs and Development (IPD) Department. This unified team of seven will begin the year by auditing all 45 country programs to assess needs and priorities. They will also conduct a benchmarking study with peer nonprofits to shape strategy and best practices. Key goals for 2025 include improving data systems, launching an online training platform (BUDs), expanding funding streams, enhancing compliance and reporting, and increasing international representation at the annual Best Buddies Leadership Conference.

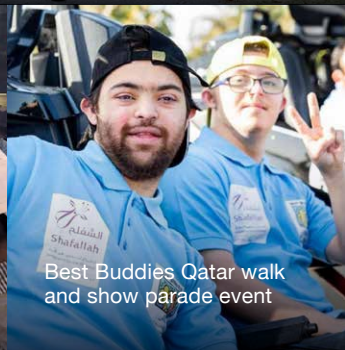

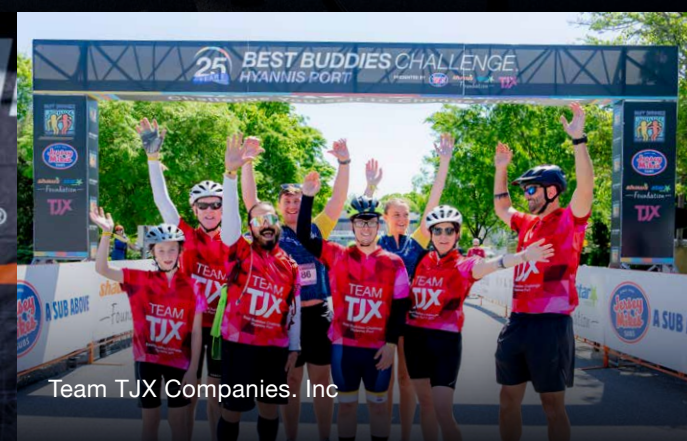

Best Buddies Challenge: California

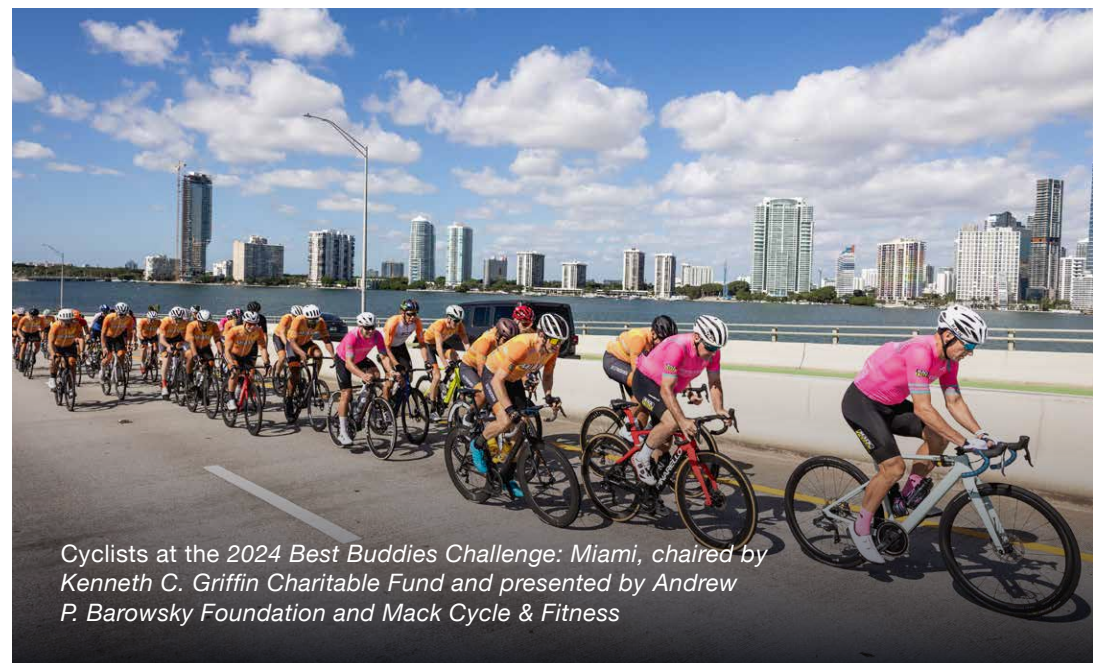
October 18-19, 2024 | Marin, CA

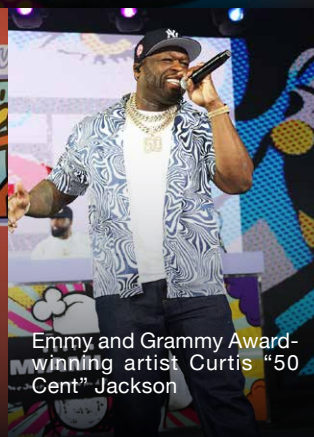

Best Buddies Champion of the Year Gala

Best Buddies Champion of the Year Gala is a competitive fundraising campaign that brings together and celebrates leaders of inclusion in local communities across the nation. Champion Candidates dedicate themselves to raising funds and awareness for Best Buddies during their campaigns. The culmination of these efforts is the Champion of the Year celebration, where the Champions are honored, and the individual who raises the most funds is named the *Champion of the Year*.

In 2024, *Champion of the Year* achieved a record-breaking milestone, hosting 52 events nationwide, with over 405 Champion Candidates, exceeding the fundraising goal by raising over \$10.3 million for Best Buddies. This year the Top 10 Champion Candidates raised a collective \$1.4 million. Nathan Dean, in Tennessee, emerged as the National Grand Champion by raising \$369,216 setting a record for the most raised ever by a Champion Candidate. Looking ahead to 2025, the goal is to recruit 450 Champions and raise \$11 million through 54 events, which will continue to raise critical funds for Best Buddies and empower community leaders to advocate for inclusion.

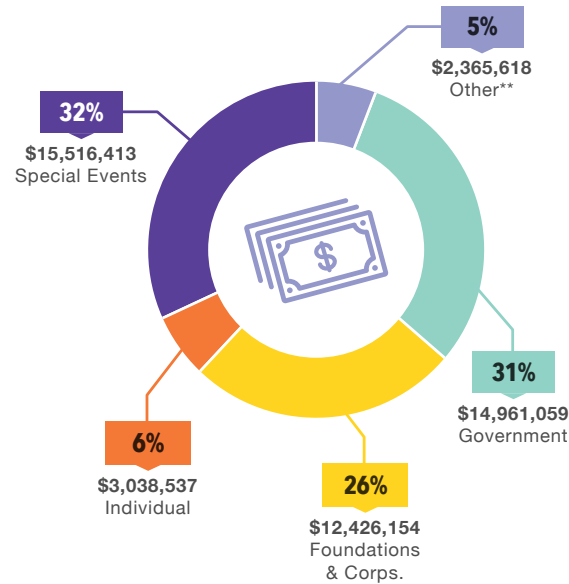

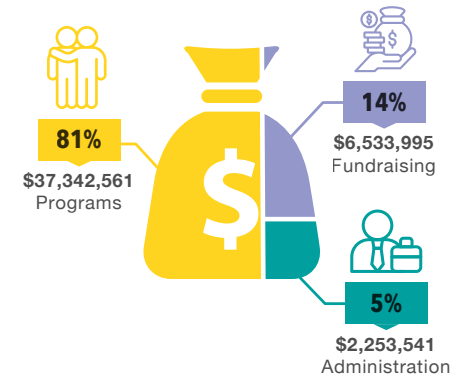

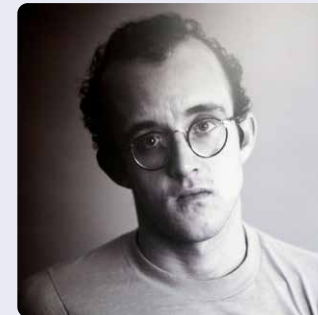

Alabama Year in Review

Best Buddies in Alabama experienced unprecedented growth throughout the year, most notably in our school presence across the state. The organization expanded from nine to 30 chapters, including the groundbreaking launch of an entire district of schools in Tuscaloosa. Currently, we have 1,141 members fostering 183 one-to-one friendship matches. Best Buddies Alabama's presence at the Best Buddies Leadership Conference (BBLC) demonstrated this momentum, as we doubled attendance from five participants in 2023 to 10 representatives from five different chapters in 2024.

Our delegation to the Best Buddies Leadership Conference achieved several milestones, including having our first state ambassador, Ian Terry, and chapter advisor in attendance. During the conference, the University of Alabama at Birmingham (UAB) chapter received the prestigious Outstanding Chapter Award, while the University of Alabama was recognized for ranking among the Top 10 Fundraising Chapters for Best Buddies Friendship Walks in 2024.

The 3rd Annual Best Buddies Friendship Walk: Alabama raised a record-breaking \$50,000 for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The event, presented by Joe Piper, Inc., took place at Patriot Park in Homewood with a satellite walk in Auburn, drawing over 385 participants on 48 teams. Notable achievements included recognition of Top Individual Fundraiser Kiley Krietz, Top Fundraising Chapter The University of Alabama, and Top Fundraising Team JM Smucker Co., while UAB earned Chapter of the Year honors.

Our Champion of the Year event at the Fennec in downtown Birmingham proved to be an inspiring celebration of friendship and community. The highlight of the evening was mission speaker Hope Benjamin, who delivered a touching message of how friendship can help us overcome our darkest of times. The event concluded with the outstanding talents of Marlana VanHoose, and through the efforts of 10 Champion candidates, the event raised over \$111,000. Most notably, the JM Smucker duo of Jud Robinson and David Carter, alongside mission partner Judd Trimm, set a new fundraising record of \$37,665!

Looking ahead to 2025, Best Buddies in Alabama plans to establish an Advisory Board and develop a structured local ambassador program. With plans to increase our Leadership Conference delegation and building on our current momentum, we are excited about the opportunities for expansion and deeper community impact across Alabama.

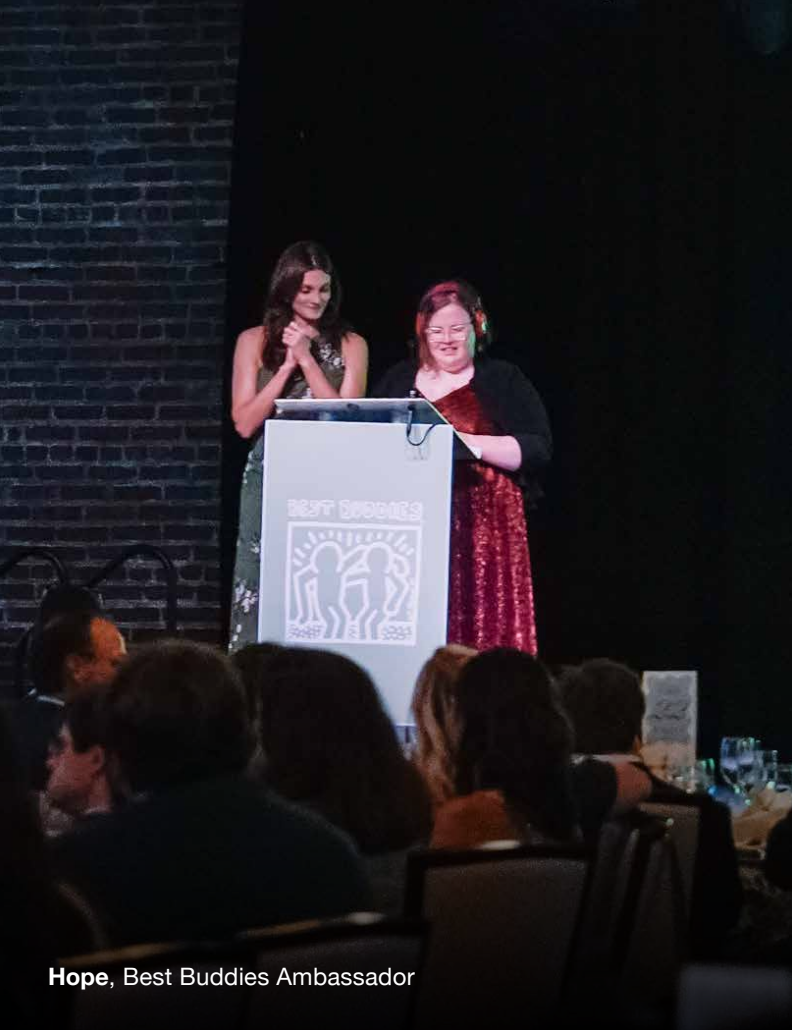

Before joining Best Buddies, my life was marked by confusion and loneliness. I was diagnosed with ADHD in second grade and misdiagnosed with Autism in middle school, making it difficult to explain why my brain worked differently. This past year, I finally received my true diagnosis - a rare genetic disorder called Houge Janssens Syndrome, which affects my speech, sensory processing, and emotional regulation. After high school, I enrolled in Crossing Points at the University of Alabama, a non-degree certificate program for individuals with intellectual disabilities.

I became involved with Best Buddies in 2018 when executive members presented at Crossing Points about the University of Alabama chapter. The decision to become a self-advocate was born from my desire to create positive change. Through my own non-profit, Finding Hope, I now work to support individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) who have been victims of crime. My goal is to ensure that others with disabilities have the same support system that Best Buddies provided me with during my darkest times.

Since joining Best Buddies, my life has transformed from one of isolation to one filled with genuine friendships and purpose. My Best Buddies friends have become family, helping me feel safe and valued, especially after experiencing a violent attack in 2023. They've shown me what true friendship means and inspired me to give back to others. Through Best Buddies, I've found a place where I truly belong.

To others with IDD, I want you to know that you deserve to feel safe, valued, and understood. According to Disabled World, the statistics of assault against people with developmental disabilities are alarming, but organizations like Best Buddies create safe spaces where we can thrive. Don't give up hope - there are people and communities ready to support, accept, and celebrate you for exactly who you are.

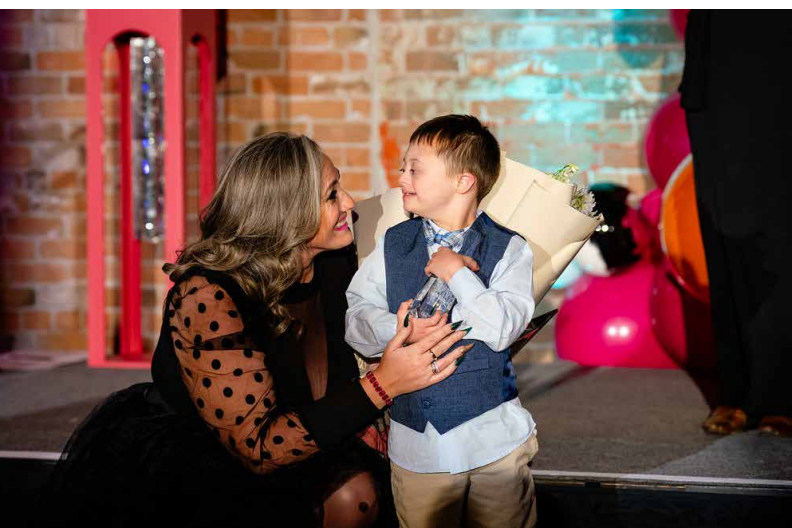

Arizona Year in Review

This year has been marked by meaningful connections, increased awareness, and impactful programs and events that have enriched the lives of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). In doing so, Best Buddies in Arizona (BBAZ) fostered more inclusive communities.

Our Friendship program in 56 schools across Arizona reached 1,500 youth, with 209 one-to-one friendship matches. BBAZ also opened new friendship chapters in two new middle schools. The Citizens program, our adult friendship program, supported 122 members with 29 one-to-one friendship matches. This year the Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) program provided training for over 70 young adults from 23 Arizona schools. Our Jobs program placed eight new individuals and continued to cultivate 19 employees with IDD in competitive and integrated employment with companies who see the value in hiring someone with IDD. The Leadership Development program provided trainings for 17 Ambassadors who acquired skills to self-advocate and, in turn, build the confidence to lead a happy and full life.

The incredible funds raised through our two signature events, the Friendship Walk and the Champion of the Year Gala, have been critical to Best Buddies in Arizona providing this lifetime of inclusion for people with IDD. In the Spring, our Friendship Walk raised over \$139,000 with over 1,000 participants coming together as an inclusive community. This year's Champion of the Year Gala reached new heights, culminating in a record-breaking moment as Kendra Verdoni was crowned Champion of the Year. Kendra, alongside her mission partner Harrison and Campaign Manager Courtney Mistico, raised \$138,755—the highest amount ever achieved by a Champion of the Year candidate in Arizona's history. With eight dedicated Champion candidates and 350 guests, the event raised over \$374,000, making it the 5th top fundraising gala in the country!

We ended the year by remembering everything to be thankful for at our 3rd annual Friendsgiving event. Program participants, families and staff enjoyed a delicious meal together, as new friendships were formed, and old friendships were made stronger.

On behalf of our Advisory Board, Junior Advisory Board, and the staff at Best Buddies, I would like to thank our generous sponsors, volunteers, and selfless donors for their support. As we step into 2025, we're excited to build on the momentum generated by the success of our programs and events in 2024.

California Year in Review

As Best Buddies in California reflect on 2024, we are filled with gratitude for the incredible progress we have made together in advancing inclusion and opportunities for individuals with disabilities. This past year has been one of growth, innovation, and impact.

One of the most significant milestones of the year was the expansion of our transitions program through the launch of Project SEARCH in Sacramento site at UC Davis Medical Center. This initiative provided nine individuals with disabilities with the opportunity to participate in three internship rotations across multiple departments, gaining valuable hands-on experience and workplace skills. This program is a testament to the power of collaboration and our shared commitment to fostering meaningful employment opportunities.

In addition, we proudly opened 29 new school friendship chapters, further expanding opportunities for connection and inclusion among students. Our adult matching program, Citizens, also experienced remarkable growth, with membership increasing by over 70%. We are also proud to share that we serve 265 individuals in integrated employment, helping them secure meaningful jobs and achieve greater independence. These milestones highlight our ongoing dedication to building strong, supportive communities at every stage of life.

Another exciting highlight of the year was our Champion of the Year gala in San Francisco, which achieved record-breaking revenue, raising over \$235,000. Additionally, we successfully relaunched the Best Buddies Friendship Walk in Fresno, bringing together our community in a powerful display of unity and support. In total, our signature events generated over \$918,000, a growth of 23% from the previous year.

Beyond this, we have continued to expand our outreach, strengthen community partnerships, and expand our outreach and strengthen community partnerships to promote accessibility and inclusion. Thanks to your unwavering support, we have been able to provide essential resources, training, and services that empower individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities to lead fulfilling lives.

As we look ahead to 2025, we are excited to launch a Best Buddies Friendship Walk in Orange County and grow our programs and team in that area. We remain dedicated to breaking down barriers, creating inclusive pathways, and ensuring that everyone has the opportunity to thrive. For much of his life, Brevin felt misunderstood. Growing up in a rural California town, his autism often defined how others saw him. He faced bullying, misjudgment, and the painful reality that people with disabilities were often treated as less capable. But then, Brevin found Best Buddies—and everything changed.

“Until recently, I believed the only ‘interesting’ fact was that I had autism. For much of my life, I’ve faced challenges that come with having autism. There were times when I felt alone, misunderstood, and unsure of where I belonged. But then, I discovered Best Buddies, and it changed everything.

I went to high school in a rural area in California where disabilities like autism were not well understood. I was often bullied due to misinformation about my disability. People with autism are often seen as not smart or incapable of making true friendships.

My journey with Best Buddies began through the Jobs program, where I interned at a major hospital. My initial intention was just to get a good job, but from there, I was invited to Citizen Socials, where adults with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities have a space to be not only friends but — Best Buddies.

For the first time, I found myself in a community that embraced me—and others like me—for who we are, where our success and full inclusion truly mattered. Best Buddies is more than just a program; it's a lifeline. It's a place where genuine connections are made, where opportunities and relationships are built that transcend disabilities and labels.

For Yvenie, becoming a resident of Best Buddies Living in Los Angeles has been truly life changing. Before joining the program in January 2024, she faced immense challenges—moving from place to place without family support, struggling with her mental health, and ultimately living in a homeless shelter. She longed for stability, independence, and a place to call home.

Best Buddies Living provided her with exactly that and more. Now, for the first time in her life, she has her own room, a steady job, and a supportive community that empowers her to thrive.

“I joined the program in January, and before Best Buddies, my life was a rollercoaster,” Yvenie shares. “I was living in a homeless shelter, struggling with my mental health, and constantly moving with no family support.”

“Best Buddies gave me a stable place to live and helped me get back on my feet. This is the first time I’ve ever had my own room. Now, I have a stable job and understand the responsibilities of being an adult. I’ve learned how to be responsible and make sure my bills are paid. I’ve learned how to budget and save money.”

One of Yvenie’s favorite aspects of Best Buddies Living is the weekly group dinners, where residents come together to share meals and connect.

“There are so many different personalities, and at first, I was nervous to talk. But over time, I’ve learned to embrace everyone,” she says. “I also feel a sense of peace at home with my roommates. The weekly meetings and group dinners encourage personal growth and provide a strong support system.”

For others with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), Yvenie hopes to inspire confidence and self-acceptance. “I want people with IDD to surround themselves with those who understand their disabilities. You shouldn’t feel bad because of your disability—you can still achieve all your goals and dreams.”

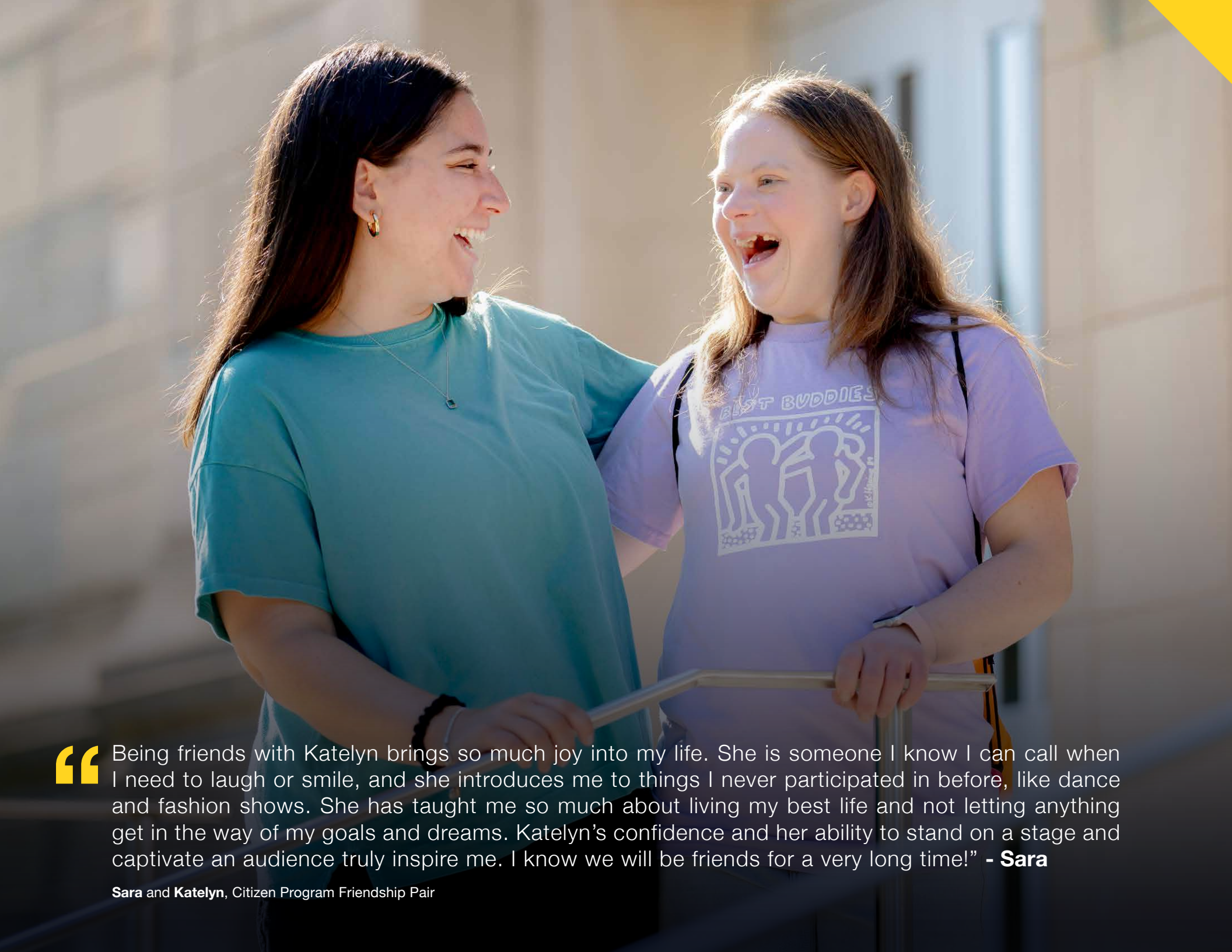

Virginia & D.C. Year in Review

Best Buddies in Virginia & Washington, D.C. experienced a year of remarkable growth and achievement for our Capital Region. With an expanding team, program enhancements, and broader outreach across all mission pillars, we have much to celebrate. This year, we had the privilege of growing in multiple dimensions—reaching more participants, families, employers and schools - impacting over 35,000 individuals across our region. Alongside our strong presence in the area, we extended our reach into previously underserved communities, notably launching our Jobs Program in Loudoun County, VA.

At the core of our mission is fostering one-to-one, meaningful friendships. This year, over 3,500 students participated in our Friendship Programs, with 20 new school chapters launched, including 12 at the elementary level. Our Citizens Friendship Program grew to 425 individuals across two chapters in the DC metro area and Richmond, VA. Our team also facilitated 600 new 1:1 matches, helping more students with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) thrive in our inclusive programs.

In 2024, we launched Best Buddies Pre-Employment Transition Services (Pre-ETS) in Northern Virginia providing essential training to 48 young adults at two schools. Additionally, our Jobs Program continued to thrive, supporting 50 individuals with IDD in securing competitive and integrated employment at 24 employers who embrace the contributions of individuals with IDD. Our second annual Best Buddies Employer Partner Celebration, hosted by Capital One, honored Supervisor of the Year, Galy Torres of JLL, and Employer of the Year, CBRE.

Our Ambassador Leadership Program also expanded, with 17 new State Ambassadors. These leaders made 60 appearances and speeches, advocating for inclusion and spreading awareness of our mission.

Our hallmark events were pivotal in our success this year. The Best Buddies Friendship Walk on the National Mall in Washington, DC, remains the largest nationwide, attracting a record-breaking 1,900 participants and raising over \$400,000 for local programs. We debuted the Richmond Friendship Walk at City Stadium, with over 200 participants celebrating in this new locale.

The Best Buddies Homecoming: Two Parties, One Purpose event was an unforgettable highlight. This joyous evening, which unites students, families, and adult supporters, raised \$311,000—surpassing our fundraising goals—thanks to the generosity of our champions and their guests. With 330 adult attendees and 500 students, Homecoming was a true testament to the power of community.

As we reflect on our successes in 2024, we are more committed than ever to our mission. With empowered student leaders, strong community and advisory board support, and steadfast advocates, we look forward to continuing our work to create friendships, secure meaningful jobs, foster self-advocacy, and shape bright futures for our Best Buddies.

The Best Buddies Transitions Program has five main components: self-advocacy/mentoring, job exploration and counseling, a work readiness overview, work-based learning opportunities, and post-secondary counseling. For Zayd and Reyan, learning these skills at this critical transitional point in their life is key to understanding and preparing for the opportunities, like working in IT, that are available after graduation.

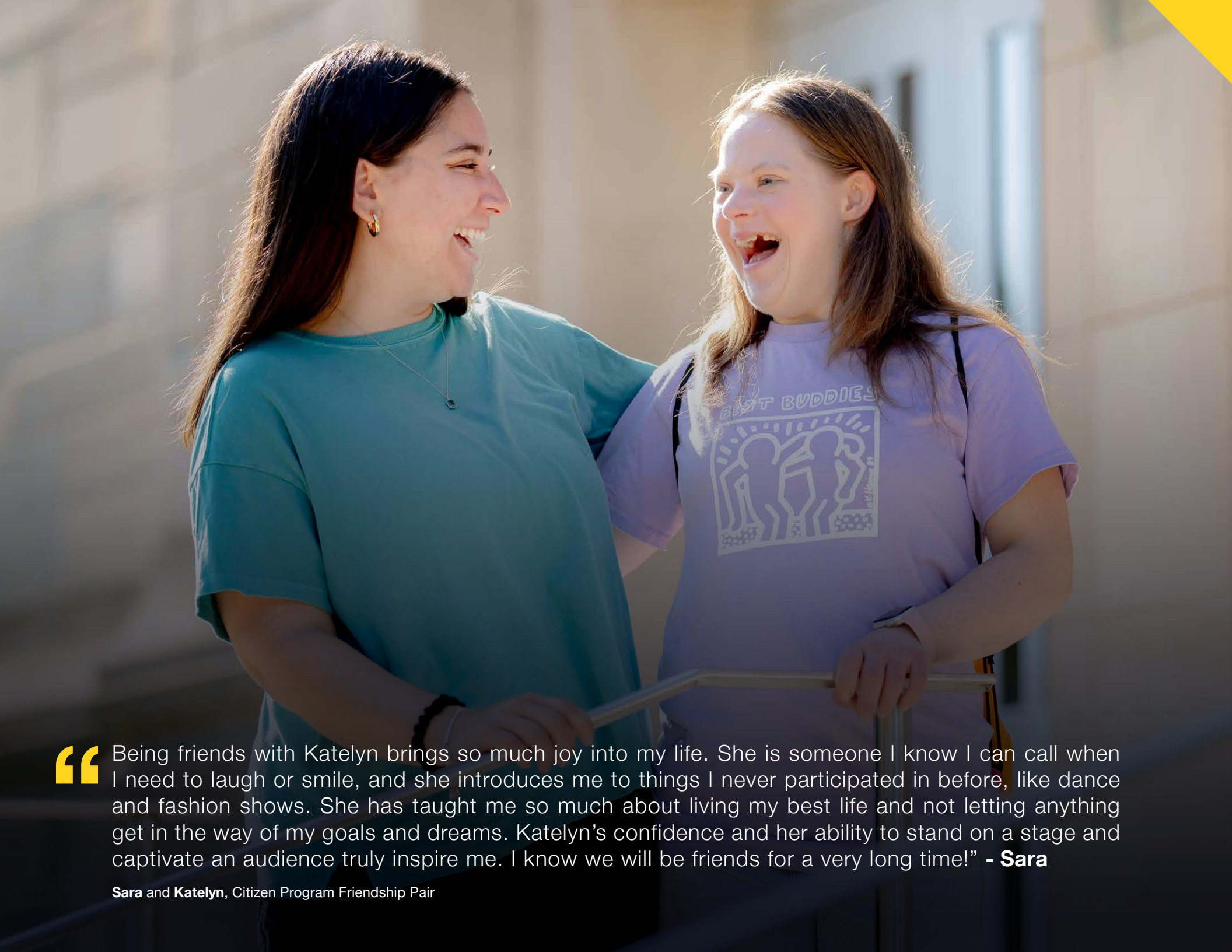

Colorado Year in Review

2024 has been a year of remarkable growth and impact for Best Buddies in Colorado. Our programs have expanded, creating more opportunities for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) to build meaningful friendships, develop leadership skills, and gain employment. We now have 874 active members in our school programs, with 198 matches, fostering inclusion and support in communities across the state. Our Citizens adult friendship program continues to thrive, offering monthly events, both virtual and in person, to keep members engaged. We also launched two major new initiatives—Eunie’s Buddies, a mentorship program supporting parents of children with IDD, and Integrated Employment, which is helping connect employers with talented employees in the IDD community. Additionally, our Advisory Board grew to 20 dedicated leaders, strengthening our statewide efforts.



Leadership development remained a key focus this year. Our Local Leadership Training Days brought together 40 student leaders, with one event hosted at Aspen High School, followed by a Dance Aspen workshop, and another at Broomfield High School. 19 delegates from Colorado attended the Best Buddies Leadership Conference, gaining valuable skills to bring back to their communities. We also hosted a successful National Disability Employment Awareness Month (NDEAM) Ambassador Training, giving participants tools to explore their dream careers. Building on this, we are launching a three-part Ambassador Training Series in 2025, focusing on resume writing, interview skills, and securing meaningful employment.

The Best Buddies Friendship Walk (BBFW) was a powerful celebration of inclusion, bringing together nearly 800 attendees across two events. The Roaring Fork Valley and mountain communities gathered in Basalt, while the Denver metro area united in Washington Park for an incredible day of connection and support. These walks not only raised awareness for the Best Buddies mission but also strengthened our community, demonstrating the impact of friendship and inclusion.

Our Champion of the Year (COY) events were an incredible success, with 14 Champions rallying their networks to raise over \$650,000 in support of Best Buddies programs. This annual event celebrates the dedication of local leaders who are committed to expanding opportunities for individuals with IDD. The funds raised will directly support school chapters, leadership training, employment programs, and community events, helping us continue our mission of inclusion across Colorado.



Looking Ahead As we move into 2025, our focus remains on expanding school programs, growing our Citizens adult friendship program, increasing employment opportunities, and continuing to strengthen leadership development. We are also excited to build upon our new initiatives, ensuring that more families, students, and employers are engaged in our mission. Thank you to everyone who has supported Best Buddies in Colorado—your dedication makes all of this possible. Here’s to an even more impactful year ahead!

At Niwot High School, the Best Buddies program fosters meaningful friendships and promotes inclusion. Taylor, a sophomore, and Allie, a senior, have been paired for about a year, forming a strong bond beyond the classroom. From Starbucks runs to browsing LEGO sets at Target, their friendship is built on fun, support, and genuine companionship. Their story highlights how intentional matching in Best Buddies creates lasting connections that enrich students' lives.

For many high school students, loneliness can be overwhelming, especially for those with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), who often face barriers to social inclusion. Best Buddies bridges this gap by pairing students in one-to-one friendships, ensuring everyone has someone to share experiences with. In Colorado, the program has expanded significantly, with 13 active chapters and nearly 200 students participating in 1:1 friendships. This growth reflects a strong commitment to inclusion, creating communities where every student feels valued and connected.

One of Taylor's favorite memories was when Allie brought her service dog, Purdue, to a Best Buddies meeting, making it a special moment for everyone. Whether through small gestures or shared experiences, these friendships emphasize the importance of inclusion in high school and beyond. Programs like Best Buddies show that friendship isn't just about having fun—it's about being there for each other, embracing differences, and ensuring no one feels alone.

Shivam's journey into self-advocacy began when his Chapter Advisor, Erin Newton, introduced him to Best Buddies. Encouraged by the support of his peers and mentors, he realized he had a voice worth sharing. As an Ambassador, Shivam's goal is to advocate for inclusion and acceptance for people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) across Colorado. His role allows him to speak at events, inspire others, and promote opportunities for people with IDD to build friendships, find employment, and become active members of their communities.

Since joining Best Buddies, Shivam's confidence and outlook on life have transformed. Through his involvement, he has discovered his passion for music and languages, and now actively pursues opportunities that align with his interests. His experiences—such as speaking in front of large crowds and visiting CPR Classical Radio Studio—have fueled his belief that he, like anyone else, can achieve his dreams.

Family Support

Launched in late 2024, Eunie's Buddies has already made a powerful impact across Colorado, generating excitement and filling a long-overdue gap in the community. Caregivers and mentors alike have shared how meaningful the program is—many expressing that they wish something like this had been available when their own journeys began. Across the board, participants have emphasized how essential this support system is for both caregivers and children. One mentor-mentee pair has already begun meeting in person, building the kind of connection they hoped for when they joined. These relationships are at the heart of Eunie's Buddies—offering encouragement, shared experience, and a sense of belonging. The program helps transform feelings of isolation into a network of genuine connections.

Since its launch, the program has enrolled 24 mentors and 22 mentees, built partnerships with 40 community organizations offering tailored services, and hosted eight community events that introduced over 1,000 people to the Best Buddies mission. Through social media, Eunie's Buddies has engaged more than 17,000 people, further amplifying awareness and connection.

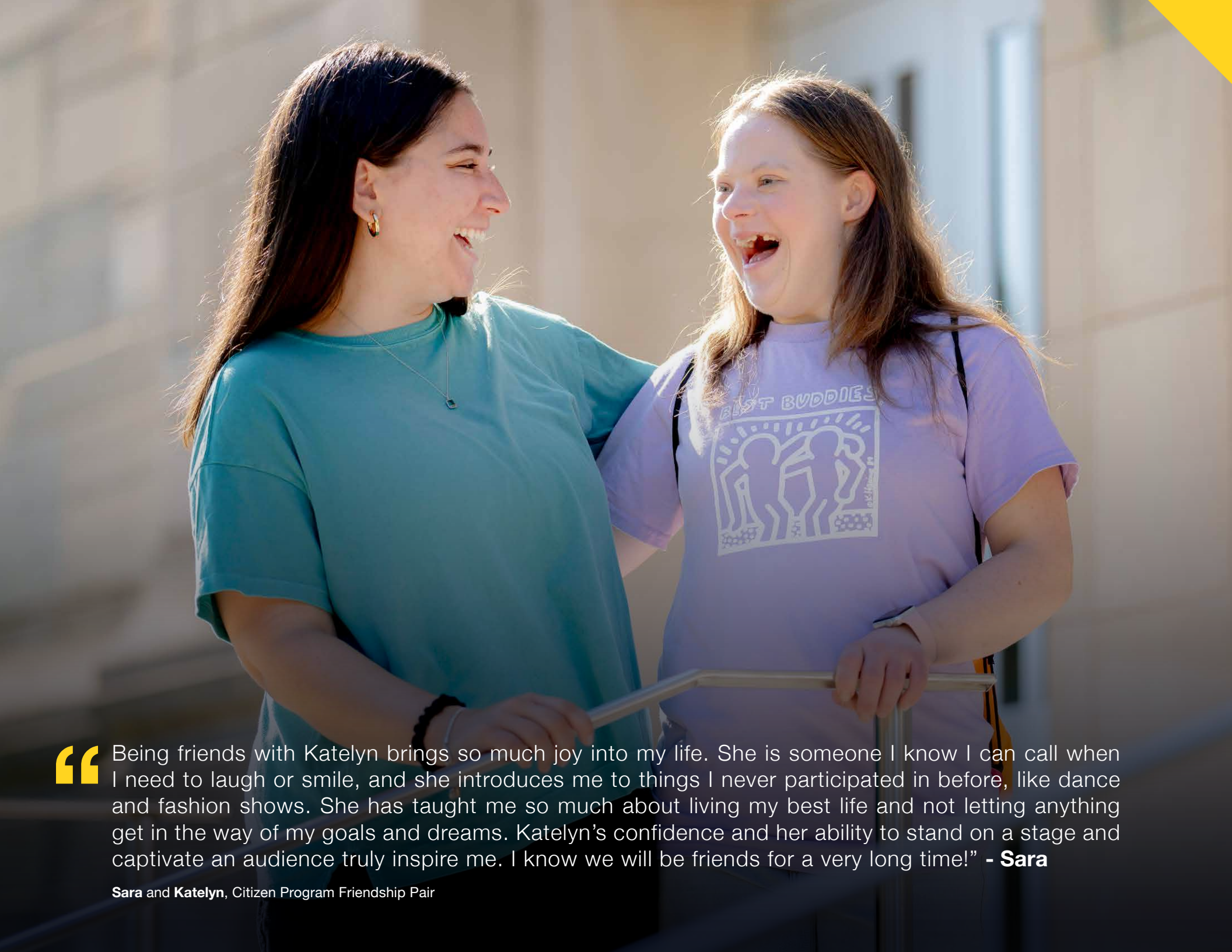
Looking ahead to 2025, the program aims to double mentor and mentee participation, create dozens of impactful caregiver-child matches, expand its presence at community events while hosting its own, and reach 100,000 people through digital outreach. Another priority will be growing the network of community partners to ensure families have access to comprehensive support. Connecticut Year in Review

2024 was an incredible year for Best Buddies in Connecticut (BBCT), marked by tremendous growth, meaningful connections, and mission-driven impact. From expanding school chapters and launching new initiatives like the Transitions program, to hosting unforgettable events like the Friendship Ball, Friendship Walks, and Champion of the Year, the BBCT community came together in powerful ways to support inclusion. We're also proud to share that our fundraising efforts were a resounding success, with every dollar going directly toward supporting individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD).

Our team worked tirelessly to strengthen and grow our foundation partnerships, expand our presence in schools, and create more leadership opportunities for our incredible volunteers. We launched the Transitions program to support job readiness, while also investing in the professional development of our staff to ensure sustainable leadership.

Through a strategic focus on school engagement, we opened seven new school chapters and reached nearly 3,000 individuals with and without IDD. We fostered growth in our Citizens program, established clear benchmarks for programmatic success, and continued to host both virtual and in-person events that bring our community together month after month.

The year started with our Friendship Ball, where close to 400 guests danced all afternoon in support of our mission. As one new parent shared, "My wife and I never thought we would be buying a prom dress for our daughter! This has been a truly amazing time, not only for our daughter but for us as a family." In the Spring, we added our first Best Buddies Friendship Walk in Fairfield County. With this new Friendship Walk, plus our Walk held at the Yard Goats stadium in Hartford, over 1,200 walkers registered and close to \$120,000 was raised. It is a true testament to the volunteers that help move the mission forward. In October, people came out in their "Denim and Diamonds" to attend the Champion of the Year event. This year's Champions worked extremely hard to become the Champion of the Year. With the generous donors that contributed to the Champions, the silent and live auctions exceeded the fundraising goal. In total, 250 guests contributed to raise nearly \$120,000.

Best Buddies in Connecticut ended 2024 on a high note and are anticipating an even stronger 2025 with plans to open more schools, advance the mission, offer more transition workshops, and achieve the program's highest financial goal to date. We extend heartfelt gratitude to all our friends, families, sponsors, volunteers, and participants for their invaluable support throughout the year. Thank you for making 2024 a truly memorable year for Best Buddies in Connecticut.

We're excited to see this momentum continue into 2025! The expansion of school friendship programs and anticipation of even larger events show that BBCT is laying a strong foundation for even greater impact. The dedication of our community—from volunteers to donors—has been essential to this success, and it's clear that everyone is deeply committed to advancing our mission of inclusion and connection.

Before joining Best Buddies, life felt different for both Taylor and Addy. For Taylor, things were often “quiet,” and she was deeply affected by how people with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD)—like her sister—were sometimes treated. “It hurt to see people disrespect each other,” she recalled. That changed when she joined Best Buddies. Being matched with Addy opened her heart even more. “I know she’ll always be there for me,” Taylor said. For Addy, who often felt overlooked by her peers, the program was a turning point. “Now I feel seen,” she shared.

Since being matched a year ago, Taylor and Addy have become inseparable. They love going to basketball games together, with Taylor proudly cheering for Addy as she performs with the cheer squad. “I know we’ll always cheer each other on,” Taylor said. Whether they’re crafting, listening to music, or just hanging out, their friendship is filled with joy and mutual support. “I always know I’ll have a close friend,” Taylor said, describing Addy as “sweet, caring, and always herself.” Addy added, “She makes me feel special, and we always have fun.”

Best Buddies has been transformative for both of them. For Taylor, it brought comfort and hope—knowing that people like her sister and Addy are valued and celebrated. “It’s taught me how special everyone is,” she said. For Addy, it created a sense of belonging. “Other people at school see and acknowledge me now,” she said.

At Ellington High, Taylor and Addy’s friendship has become an inspiring example of what true connection looks like. Their bond reminds everyone of the power of kindness, inclusion, and the importance of being seen and valued for exactly who you are.

Delaware Year in Review

Reflecting on 2024, I am overwhelmed with gratitude for the incredible strides we've made together. This year brought growth, meaningful connections, and a strengthened commitment to inclusion. Thanks to the unwavering support of our volunteers, partners, and participants, we expanded programs, forged new partnerships, and deepened our impact for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) across Delaware.

Our school and adult Citizens chapters flourished. We currently have 30 school chapters serving 970 student participants. We hosted two trainings where 35 student leaders and advisors were trained in advocacy and leadership. These school chapters hosted over 180 events combined in 2024! Our Adult program serves over 400 members and held monthly inclusive gatherings, bringing together over 70 people with and without IDD at each event.

A 2024 highlight was the Best Buddies Friendship Walk at Frawley Stadium, where 400+ attendees helped raise an incredible \$46,000! It was a day of joy and celebration, recognizing our dedicated student leaders and volunteers. Another milestone was the Champion of the Year Gala, where we set a new fundraising record of over \$56,000. With 120+ guests in attendance, we shared heartfelt stories, laughter, and a vision of inclusion that continues to drive our mission forward.

Looking ahead to 2025, we are excited to build on this momentum—expanding into new schools, particularly within the Brandywine School District, and strengthening our existing chapters to increase participation in our Friendship Walk and Gala.

None of this would be possible without our incredible Best Buddies Delaware community. As we embark on another year of growth, we remain committed to fostering a world where everyone is valued, included, and celebrated.

Florida Year in Review

In 2024, Best Buddies in Florida demonstrated the boundless power of connection, creating vibrant opportunities for individuals with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Across 128 cities, our friendship programs brought together 8,824 participants in 265 schools and colleges, building a statewide movement of inclusion, empathy, and empowerment. At the core of everything we do are the friendships that break barriers and spark possibilities. These life changing relationships are the foundation of the Best Buddies experience—fostering belonging, building confidence, and transforming communities.

The Best Buddies Transition Program, designed to equip students aged 14–21 with IDD to transition seamlessly into life after graduation, entered its sixth year in 2024. Hosting 10 cohorts and 150 students statewide, we empowered students to forge paths tailored to their goals, from employment to further education, certification courses, or volunteerism. Thanks to the visionary support of our generous partners, the program expanded in 2024 to new regions across Florida, amplifying its reach and impact.

Our focus on employment continues to change lives through the Best Buddies Jobs program. Operating in six Florida markets, this initiative supported 232 individuals with IDD in securing or maintaining meaningful jobs. By partnering with companies like Canteen, Michaels, and VoLo Foundation, we are not only creating economic opportunities but also redefining workplace inclusion.

Best Buddies staff members representing our seven regional offices were busy hosting workshops, training sessions, and events that empowered participants and student leaders to thrive. A standout moment was the Best Buddies Leadership Conference in Bloomington, Indiana, where Florida's student delegation came together to exchange ideas, celebrate successes, and grow as leaders. Additionally, through the Best Buddies Ambassador program, more than 80 participants gained the skills to share their stories and advocate for inclusion in their communities.

As always, our two signature events: Friendship Walk and Champion of the Year Gala, raised awareness and funds (over \$2 million dollars collectively) while bringing out thousands of community supporters all championing the Best Buddies mission of friendship and inclusion.

The Friendship Ball was a standout moment of the year—a night to remember where over 1,000 students from across the state came together to celebrate the friendships and connections that make Best Buddies so impactful. Joyful, inclusive, and inspiring, this annual event beautifully reflected the spirit of the year: friendships that change lives.

Finally, with the addition of a new organization wide pillar: Best Buddies Family Support, the Miami market was proud to launch Eunie's Buddies. This initiative connects experienced parents of children with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) with new parents—whether they are expecting, have recently welcomed a baby, or are navigating a new diagnosis for a child up to age eight. Eunie's Buddies provides a framework offering parents and caregivers encouragement, emotional support, and valuable resources.

As we close the chapter on 2024, we are energized by what lies ahead. Together with our volunteers, donors, corporate champions, and school partners, we are creating a future where every individual is seen, valued, and empowered to thrive.

Thank you for being part of this journey. Together, we'll continue to rewrite what's possible for individuals with IDD—one friendship, one opportunity, and one milestone at a time.

Now a State Ambassador and active Citizen's participant, her story highlights the journey of finding her voice, gaining self-confidence, and learning to advocate for others.

Growing up with SMA and being neurodivergent, Joie faced many challenges, and sometimes those challenges made her feel as if she was all alone. Despite having people around that cared about her, Joie still felt a barrier that was hard to overcome. She dreamt of the day that she would find friends that would see past her wheelchair and disability and see the real Joie- someone full of passion, optimism, humor, and dreams.

From the first Best Buddies event she attended, Joie was welcomed with open arms and without question. In that moment, Joie realized that she no longer had to stand on the outside looking in—Best Buddies had become her community and her home.

This initial impact inspired Joie to continue participating in the program, eventually becoming involved with the Tampa Citizens chapter, and challenging herself to develop her leadership skills so that she could serve as an ambassador and advocate for others like herself. Through Best Buddies, Joie learned that the challenges she faces do not define her — they are just a part of her story.

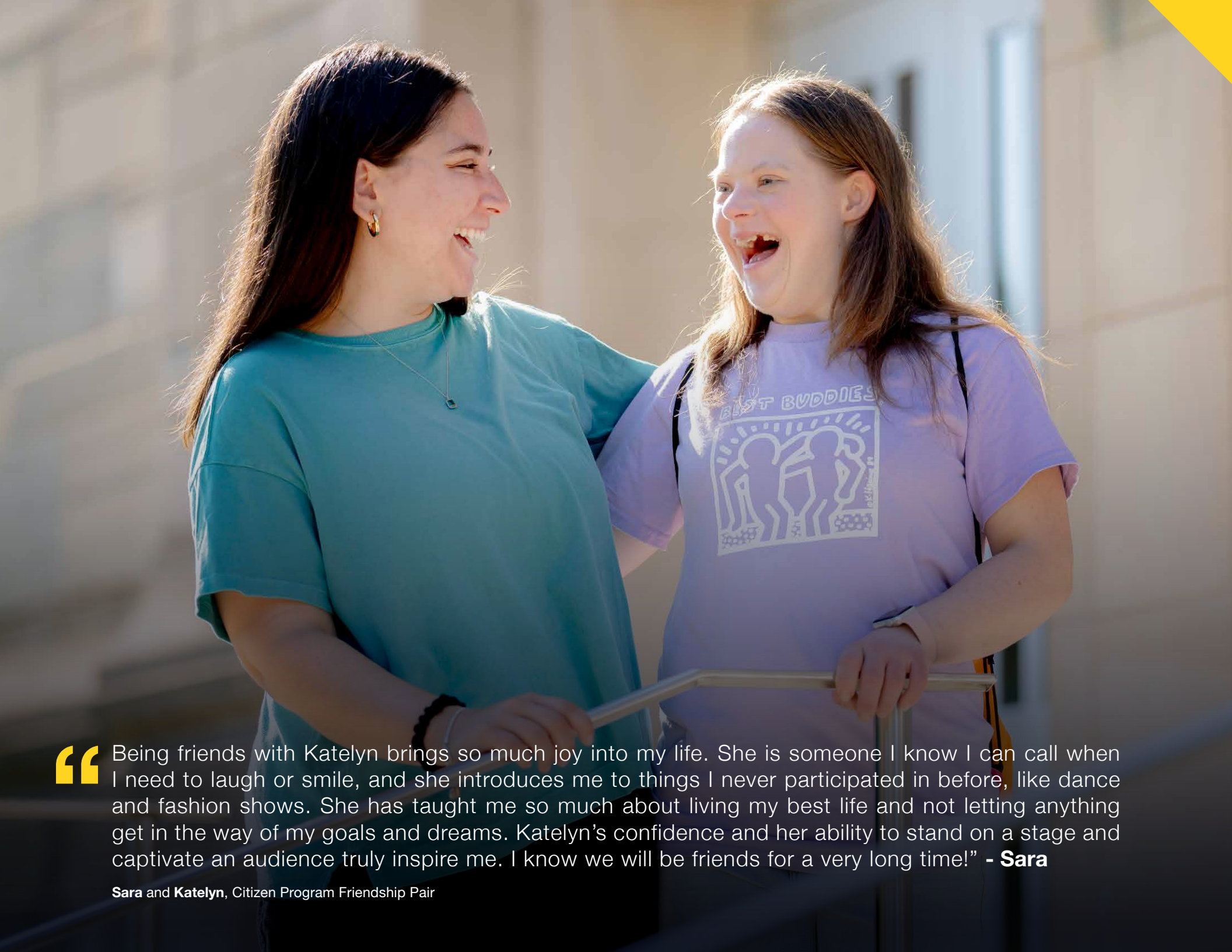

Georgia Year in Review

At the start of 2024, Best Buddies in Georgia set ambitious goals to expand its programs and impact across the state. Under the leadership of State Director Katie Stanton and with guidance from the Best Buddies in Georgia Advisory Board, we laid a strong foundation for growth that carried throughout the year.

By year's end, our Friendship Schools program grew from 35 to 50 schools, fostering more inclusive communities. The Citizens program reached 111 people with 34 matches. Our Leadership Development efforts exceeded expectations in 2024, with five successful trainings that equipped 30 participants with essential leadership skills. The Jobs Program also surpassed its goals—enrolling 12 participants and securing seven job placements, particularly in the Sports & Entertainment and Arts & Culture sectors. Best Buddies Living continued to grow, now home to six residents, further advancing our mission to provide inclusive and meaningful independent living opportunities.



Across Georgia, Best Buddies Friendship Walks united communities in a powerful celebration of inclusion. On April 20, 548 walkers gathered at Blackburn Park for the Best Buddies Friendship Walk: Atlanta, raising \$57,312. The excitement continued with our Best Buddies Friendship Walk: Coastal Georgia on April 21 in Guyton, where 260 participants walked at South Effingham High School, raising \$10,340. The series wrapped up on April 28 with the Best Buddies Friendship Walk: Middle Georgia at Middle Georgia State University in Macon, with 51 walkers raising \$3,021.

Our 2024 Champion of the Year event, held November 1 at the historic Biltmore, was an unforgettable Bridgerton-inspired evening. Guests enjoyed a Georgia-inspired dinner provided by our sponsor, Touchpoint, before dancing the night away. Thanks to our generous community, the event raised \$139,551. Eleven champion pairs took the stage, showcasing the power of inclusion, with Martha Haythorn and Hannah Jenkins crowned Champions of the Year.



Looking ahead, 2025 will be even bigger. Best Buddies in Georgia will expand to reach 60 schools, place 12 additional job participants in meaningful employment, and bring our Best Buddies Living program residential program to full capacity with nine residents and five members in both male- and female-identifying living units. With fundraising goals of \$85,000 from our Friendship Walks and over \$200,000 from Champion of the Year, we're building the resources needed to sustain and grow our mission. With our dedicated team and incredible community, 2025 will be a year of unprecedented success!

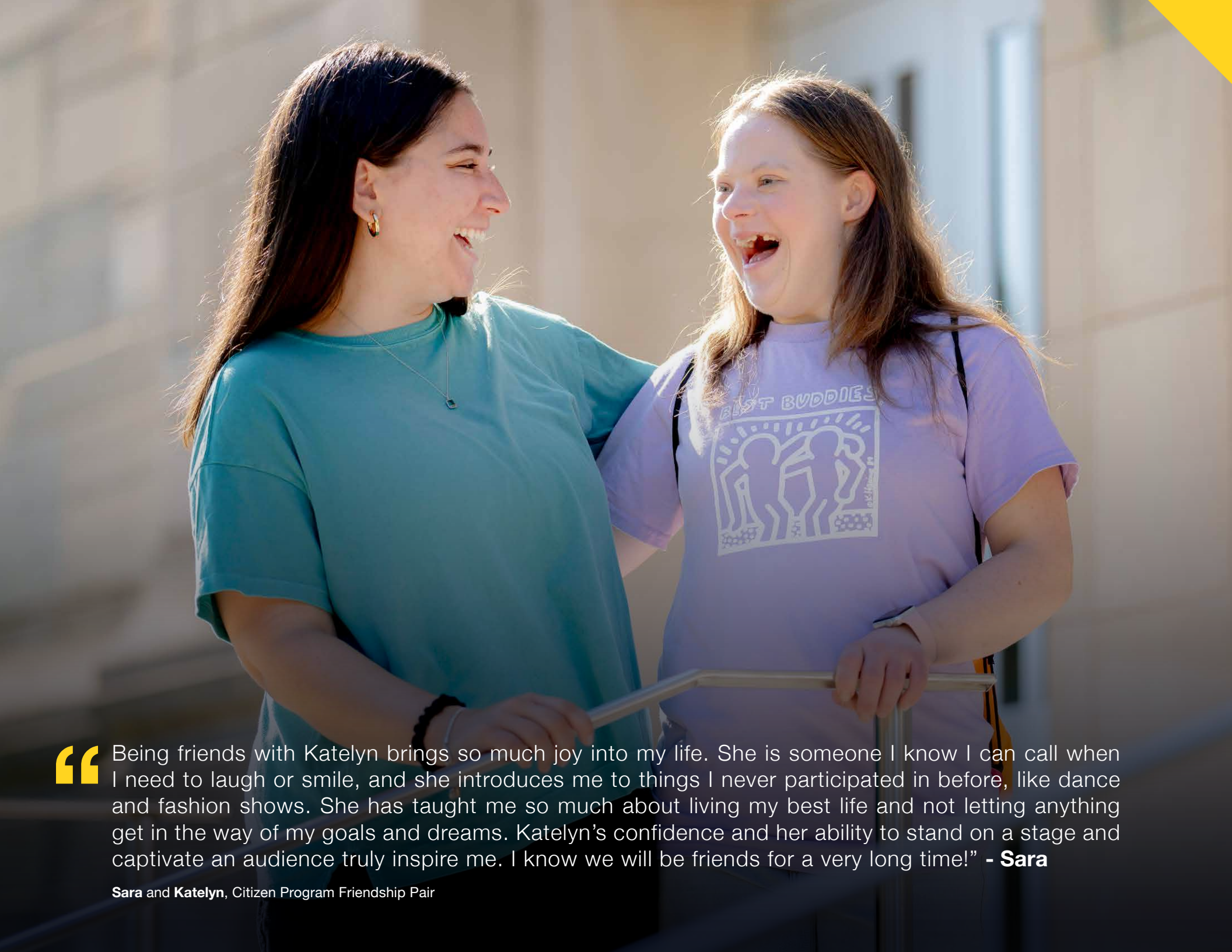

2024 has brought growth and learning opportunities for Best Buddies in Hawai'i. We are so grateful to have amazing volunteers and ambassadors who continue to spread the mission of inclusion. The staff at Best Buddies in Hawai'i (BBHI) have soared in expanding friendship programs with 2 new elementary schools, providing programmatic support for over 400 participants with and with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), and promoter chapters like Punahou School and University Laboratory School engaging in projects that support disability awareness.

BBHI traveled to Indiana University with 12 participants for the annual Best Buddies International Leadership Conference. It was amazing to see an increase in Ambassadors learning from their peers and developing their platforms. We also hosted our first Friendship Ball at the Blue Note Hawai'i in November. This spectacular evening provided 75 participants with the opportunity to dress in high fashion, celebrate over great food, meet and network with new and old friends while dancing the night away. Having this event struck opportunities for independence for our participants to make new friends and to be themselves.

The annual Best Buddies Friendship Walk on O'ahu, Maui and Hawai'i Island hosted over 500 Best Buddies participants and their families at local malls, parks and beaches this past year. This event brought the community together when it needed it most and we are thankful to our amazing volunteers, supporters, and generous donors and partners. The statewide event raised \$39,000.00 to support the programs in Hawai'i. We look forward to raising more in 2025 and engaging our community to support opening more programs.

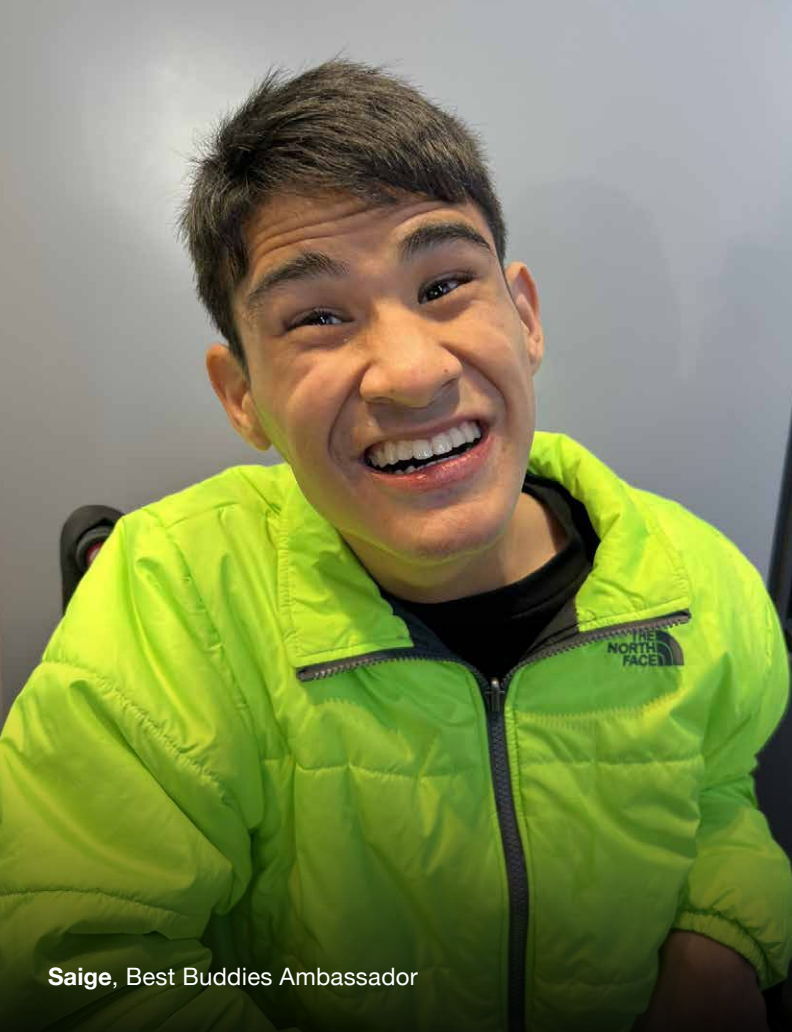

Illinois Year in Review

Best Buddies in Illinois continues to provide program participants with opportunities and resources to overcome the social and economic isolation that individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) face every day. Our work in Illinois supports social engagement and mental well-being by facilitating friendships, fostering leadership development, and supporting inclusive employment throughout Illinois.

We closed out 2024 with 155 active school Friendship chapters across Illinois—a powerful milestone that reflects the strength and reach of our mission. The true impact of these chapters is seen in the meaningful friendships formed and the inclusive events hosted in schools across the state. One standout example is Andrew and Allison from Centennial High School in Champaign. Their connection embodies how friendship can transform school communities and drive a culture of inclusion throughout Illinois.

We also supported new Ambassador leaders through numerous training events and then as active voices in their communities. State Ambassador Zach Fintel proudly spoke at events in the Chicago area, and was one of the many participants again featured in the commercial featuring Best Buddies' national partnership with Jersey Mike's Subs.

Staff are leading supplemental hands-on training to 51 students in High School Transition programs who are now seeking more advanced workplace opportunities thanks to Best Buddies. The Best Buddies Jobs team placed 28 people into integrated employment in Illinois during 2024, including participants like Jeet Dave, who are improving their workplaces and are valuable members of their teams. These placements are also helping our participants achieve their personal and financial goals.

Our core mission pillars united communities at four Friendship Walks held in Chicago, Normal, Champaign, and Will County, where nearly 2,200 participants came together to celebrate inclusion and friendship. At the Chicago Marathon, 65 dedicated runners took to the course to champion our cause. We also raised nearly \$500,000 through our Galas in Chicago and Peoria led by our twenty-one Champions including Grand Champions Nicole Marty and Joey O'Brien. This remarkable support fuels the continued growth of our programs. We're especially grateful to Aetna Better Health of Illinois, the DuPage Foundation, Walsh Construction, and The Yard for leading the way and helping us expand our impact in the year ahead.

We are deeply thankful for the incredible support of our Best Buddies participants, corporate partners, sponsors, foundations, and community advocates who help ensure individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities are included in every part of our communities. With this strong foundation, Best Buddies in Illinois is excited to reach new heights and make an even greater impact in 2025.

“Best Buddies worked hard to find me a job and provided accommodations throughout the hiring process in support of my disabilities,” said Jeet. “My life improved, not only economically but mentally and socially.”

Ultimately, Jeet was hired at Ally Financial with the assistance of Best Buddies and over two years of office work experience.

“The part I love most about my job is that my colleagues are very nice, friendly, and cooperative,” said Jeet. “I feel secure and safe in my work environment and, my job gives me opportunities to be social and continue advancing my professional skills.”

With a stable job and a steady income, Jeet has taken on personal financial responsibilities, including credit card payments and other necessary expenses. Looking ahead, he envisions getting married and starting a family.

I began attending Hawthorne Scholastic Academy at age 7, shortly after being diagnosed with autism. It was there that I began to learn how to make friends and received the support I needed to grow both academically and socially. That foundation helped me earn a spot at Walter Payton College Prep High School, one of Chicago's selective enrollment schools. Walter Payton was a tough environment—especially for someone like me, whose brain works a little differently. I faced real challenges. But in 2008, something life-changing happened: I joined Best Buddies.

A teacher introduced me to Best Buddies while I was still at Walter Payton. At the time, I had no idea how much that introduction would shape my future. I went on to join the Best Buddies chapters at my schools, and later became involved in the Citizens, Jobs, and Ambassadors programs. I even competed in Champion of the Year. At DePaul University, I continued my involvement and was honored to give a speech on the Spread the Word: Inclusion campaign. That experience lit a spark in me—I began to realize my passion for advocacy.

Attending the Best Buddies Leadership Conference was a turning point. The speakers inspired me deeply, and I knew then that I wanted to become a public speaker—to share my story, motivate others, and make an impact just like those speakers made on me. Though I still face challenges every day, I meet them with determination and continue to succeed in my own unique ways.

Best Buddies has transformed my life. I've learned what true friendship feels like. I've found joy in social events, and I've gained confidence, employment opportunities, leadership skills, and a powerful sense of belonging. I'm incredibly grateful for the Best Buddies staff who have believed in me, supported me, and created an environment where I feel safe, seen, and included.

Indiana Year in Review

Best Buddies in Indiana (BBIN) remains dedicated to fostering friendship, leadership development, and inclusive employment for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD), creating a more inclusive Hoosier state.

In 2024, our impact grew, with more than 5,200 participants engaged in Best Buddies programs across Indiana. Our Friendship program expanded into seven new schools, bringing our total to 100 school chapters statewide. Additionally, we now have over 160 trained student leaders, and eight participants with IDD serving as Best Buddies Ambassadors—amplifying the voices of inclusion and advocacy.

Our Best Buddies Jobs program also saw continued growth and retention, helping four adult participants secure meaningful employment in the community. The program now serves 30 participants, with 22 currently employed, demonstrating the importance of workplace inclusion.

In the spring, we hosted the Best Buddies Friendship Walks in Indianapolis and Lake County, welcoming more than 2,000 walkers and raising an impressive \$187,000 to support our statewide programs. These events brought together Best Buddies participants, families, volunteers, and community members, all walking in support of inclusion and friendship.

Our fall Champion of the Year campaign recruited incredible Champions who raised critical funds and awareness for our mission. At the Best Buddies Champion of the Year Gala in November, we celebrated Donna Simerly, the 2024 Best Buddies Champion of the Year in Indiana, along with his Mission Partner, Michael Wheeler. The event welcomed over 215 guests and raised over \$164,000 to support our programs.

As we look ahead to 2025, BBIN is committed to expanding our friendship, leadership development, and jobs programs, ensuring more youth and adults—both with and without IDD—experience the power of inclusion. With the support of our volunteers, participants, employers, donors, corporate partners, and advocates, we will continue to move our mission forward and make a lasting impact across Indiana.

Together, we are building a more inclusive future!

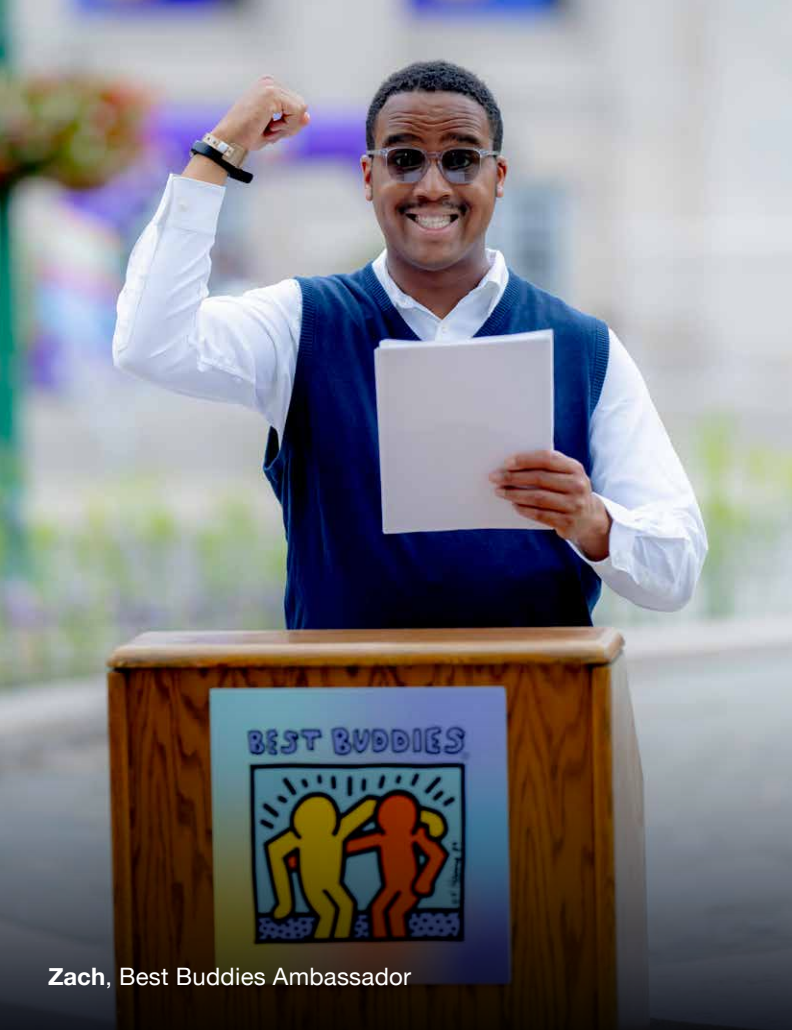

Iowa Year in Review

Best Buddies Iowa experienced amazing change and growth in 2024. Our one-to-one friendship and leadership development programs served over 2,500 people with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) across many rural and metro communities. We opened 12 new school chapters, partnering with 51 schools in total, from elementary to college, to promote inclusion and belonging for all students. Our jobs program has added eight new participants, all while maintaining a 100% job retention rate. We've been able to accomplish all of this in a year where we have promoted a new state director as well as hired a new program manager.

In line with our mission to spread awareness about the importance of inclusion, our staff team trained 54 Ambassadors and student leaders to be inclusion advocates, hosted disabilities awareness trainings with several companies, and brought 32 student leaders, chapter advisors and Ambassadors to the acclaimed Best Buddies International Leadership Conference in Bloomington, Indiana. We've also been fortunate enough to partner with several local sports teams, hosting Best Buddies days with the Iowa Wolves, Iowa Cubs, and the Iowa Wild.

Our Friendship Walk this past year was the biggest that Iowa has ever had. Hosted at the Iowa State Fairgrounds, we were able to provide an amazing party for over 500 participants, their friends and families. We raised nearly \$100,000 through our various sponsors and community fundraisers.

Best Buddies in Iowa went back to the drawing board for its Gala event this fall, the Chef and Champion Challenge. Twelve local chefs served up dishes to treat all our guests, as we celebrated six Champion candidates vying for the title of Champion of the Year. Having a fresh program provided the spark that raised close to \$200,000.

On behalf of our Advisory Board and the staff at Best Buddies in Iowa, I would

like to thank our generous sponsors, dedicated volunteers, and selfless donors for your support. Moving into 2025, we intend to build on this momentum to partner with more schools, empower our volunteers, grow our community-based programs, and engage more companies to spread awareness about the importance of inclusion. Best Buddies in Kentucky could not be prouder and more grateful for our achievements in 2024! Headed into 2024, we set an ambitious goal to create more inclusive communities, grow our ambassador programs and open more school chapters. We are proud to report that by year's end, we did just that. We opened new school chapters totaling 37 chapters in 2024 and we finished the year impacting over 9,800 families. Great things are happening in Kentucky, a state that spans two time zones and has 120 counties – the fourth most counties in the country!

Our success was only made possible by the hard work and dedication of our Kentucky team. This includes former Director, Mission Advancement, Emily Brunderman, who in 2024 took her many talents to the grant writing team at Best Buddies. We also could not have succeeded without Savannah Von Dylén, who joined the Kentucky team in 2024 as lead program manager.

Kentucky hosted its annual Friendship Walk in the spring and we saw terrific turnout on a beautiful spring Saturday at Louisville's EP Tom Sawyer Park. Over 600 participants enjoyed live music and snacks as we raised \$64,000.00, exceeding our goal. It truly was a day full of inclusion, community and happiness.

In October, Best Buddies Kentucky put on the Champions of the Year Gala. We welcomed 275 attendees at the historic grounds at Farmington, a colonial-era farm where Abraham Lincoln visited as a young man! Our Champions raised a grand total of over \$175,000, exceeding our goal of \$155,000. From the live DJ music to locally sourced food to perfect fall weather, it was a night to remember.

We finished 2024 with a confident look ahead to 2025. Best Buddies Kentucky is gearing up for big things to happen and can't wait to continue supporting the mission of Best Buddies in our local Kentucky communities. With our dedicated team, chapters, donors, and Buddies, we have already hit the ground running in 2025!

Maine Year in Review

Best Buddies in Maine (BBME) set bold goals in all areas for 2024 and proudly surpassed them all. Our Friendship chapters continued to expand statewide, and we finished the year with 52 total chapters, 1237 participants and over 5000 Mainers impacted by our programs. In July, Maine sent 39 student leaders and chapter advisors to the Best Buddies Leadership Conference in Indiana, more than doubling our size from 2023. The hands-on training these leaders receive directly impacts their local chapters, creating a foundation for success in the '24-25 school year. Lastly, we officially launched our Transitions Program in the Fall of 2024, which is a leadership program designed to empower students ages 14-22 years old by equipping them with the skills and confidence needed to take ownership of their futures after high school. This program perfectly complements our Friendship Chapters, and we can't wait to see its impact.



BBME again hosted two successful Friendship Walks in 2024, experiencing remarkable growth, with attendance and funds raised both surpassing previous years. This increase underscores the strength and impact of our programs, highlighting the deepening connections and friendships formed within our community. Our Promoter Chapter Cheverus High School again hosted our Portland Walk, raising nearly \$80,000 with over 600 in attendance. We returned to Bass Park for our Bangor Walk which doubled in size from 2023, with 150 walkers and \$15,000 raised. These substantial increases reflect the growing commitment and generosity of our supporters, enabling us to continue fostering inclusive communities and empowering individuals with IDD.

Our annual Champion Gala was a beautiful, mission-focused evening that celebrated the 10-week campaign of 12 motivated, inspiring champions. We highlighted a high school buddy pair whose genuine friendship is emblematic of the power of our programs. Their message of the importance of an inclusive school community inspired a room of 650 guests, raising \$300,000. We continue to grow our Circle of Champions and every year they raise the bar on what the collectively can accomplish all in the name of inclusion.

Maryland Year in Review

2024 was a year of continued growth and expansion, marked by strong friendships, meaningful employment opportunities, and inspiring leadership for Best Buddies in Maryland. It was a year that truly showcased the power of inclusion and belonging.

Through our school Friendship Program, served 3,427 of students and successfully matched 459 in one-to-one friendships. Additionally, we were thrilled to add a new focus on transitions to help students prepare for life beyond high school. We welcomed 47 students from Walt Whitman and Bowie High Schools, who participated in 10 workshops covering essential skills, such as self-advocacy, self-determination, resume building, and interview preparation. This is a program we are excited to expand further in 2025.

The Best Buddies Leadership Conference (BBLC) made its triumphant return to Indiana University. It was a weekend full of new friendships, enhanced leadership skills, and countless memories. Over 1,500 participants from around the world attended, including 59 students, job participants, and ambassadors from Maryland. These participants returned to their schools, workplaces, and communities with new skills to further advance our mission of inclusion.

Among our chapter highlights this year were the annual Best Buddies Buddy Ball, Citizens Summer Fest, two Ambassador Summits, and several Ambassador Hangouts. These events continue to be central to our efforts to create a more inclusive and connected community.

The Best Buddies Friendship Walk, held at the University of Maryland on Saturday, May 4, 2024, was another major milestone. With almost 90 teams and over 735 participants, we raised more than \$314,000. We were honored to have University of Maryland Head Football Coach, Mike Locksley, and many players from the football team join us in supporting our mission of inclusion. This year, we saw record-breaking corporate sponsorship, and we are deeply grateful to our founding sponsor, Shulman Rogers, as well as our legacy sponsors and the many other corporate partners and teams that made this success possible.

A truly special event in 2024 was the Champion of the Year Gala at Live Casino and Hotel on October 21, 2024. The evening was a tremendous success, with over 200 guests and more than \$118,000 raised. Our Grand Champion, Mary Snowdon, raised an impressive \$23,687 dollars for Best Buddies in Maryland. The event also featured six local restaurants offering tasting portions of their favorite cuisines, making it a memorable night for all.

As I reflect on the incredible work we accomplished in 2024, I am reminded that none of it would have been possible without the dedication and commitment of so many individuals. Our team members, Advisory Board, school partners, participants, employer partners, community organizations, donors, and our passionate community members played an integral role in creating a more inclusive Maryland. We are forever grateful for your unwavering support, determination, and passion.

As we look to 2025, we're energized by the opportunities ahead. Together, we will build on our momentum and create an even greater impact.

Through virtual meetings, he was introduced to his buddy family and developed a close bond with his buddy, Katie. When school returned in person, Best Buddies supported him in making meaningful connections, and Anderson quickly became an active and engaged member of his chapter.

As Anderson’s passion for inclusion grew, he decided to take on a leadership role. In his sophomore year, he became Buddy Director on the Executive Board, his first leadership position. “Best Buddies showed me a path to unlocking my potential,” he shares. Embracing the chance to be a self-advocate, Anderson worked to bring guest speakers to chapter meetings and organized dance parties that inspired his peers. It was through this leadership that Anderson discovered his passion for motivating others. His newfound confidence led to the launch of his own DJ business, where he’s now completed over 50 paid jobs and numerous pro-bono gigs for nonprofits.

Anderson’s leadership skills didn’t stop there. He expanded his involvement by joining student government, becoming a teacher’s assistant, and managing the JV basketball team. As the first special needs assistant coach at Open Door Sports, Anderson has become a key advocate for inclusion and self-empowerment. “Best Buddies gave me the chance to take on roles that allowed me to grow as a leader and advocate,” he says.

In addition to his leadership journey, Anderson’s role as an Ambassador through the Transition Program at Walt Whitman High School has been life changing. Through this program, he and his peers develop essential skills like resume building and interview preparation, paving the way for a brighter future. “Best Buddies has the power to help people with disabilities make meaningful friendships and be included,” Anderson says. As an Ambassador, Anderson continues to advocate for the inclusion and potential of individuals with IDD.

Massachusetts & Rhode Island Year in Review

Best Buddies in Massachusetts (MA) and Rhode Island (RI) continued to grow and thrive in 2024.

Our Friendship programs served 238 chapters, impacting over 55,000 individuals from early childhood through adulthood and helping to build friendships and social inclusion for people with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). For individuals ages 14-22, our Transitions program worked in 20 schools with 134 students with IDD on career exploration, self-advocacy, and workplace readiness. Best Buddies Jobs continues to facilitate a more inclusive workforce in Massachusetts, now serving over 206 adults with IDD with 86 employer partners. Best Buddies Jobs staff work with participants on job development and ongoing support and work with our employer partners to provide diversity, equity, and inclusion training and best practices for inclusion in the workplace. Our Leadership pillar continued to thrive, with 27 active trained leaders and 87 training events. Notably, two of our ambassadors spoke at the Best Buddies Leadership Conference at University of Indiana in July 2024. We had over 80 chapter leaders, job participants, ambassadors, and transition students attend in order to gain skills to take back home with them. Our Family Support program, Eunie's buddies launched in 2024 with the goal of providing support and resources needed to navigate the journey of raising a child with IDD.

In 2024, we proudly hosted three Friendship Walks—held in Boston, Worcester, and Providence. These walks collectively raised over \$215,000 and involved over 1,800 people. Other events, such as our Evening of Opportunity and Hyannis Port Golf Tournament, alongside our teams at the Boston Marathon and Falmouth Road Race, helped raise funds to support our programs. The money raised from the Friendship Walks and other local events directly supports and expands our programs in MA and RI.

We fostered programmatic growth and served more people than ever across both states with 2024 being one of our strongest years. I sincerely thank all our supporters for helping us foster inclusion in our communities for people with and without IDD to make MA and RI more welcoming for all.

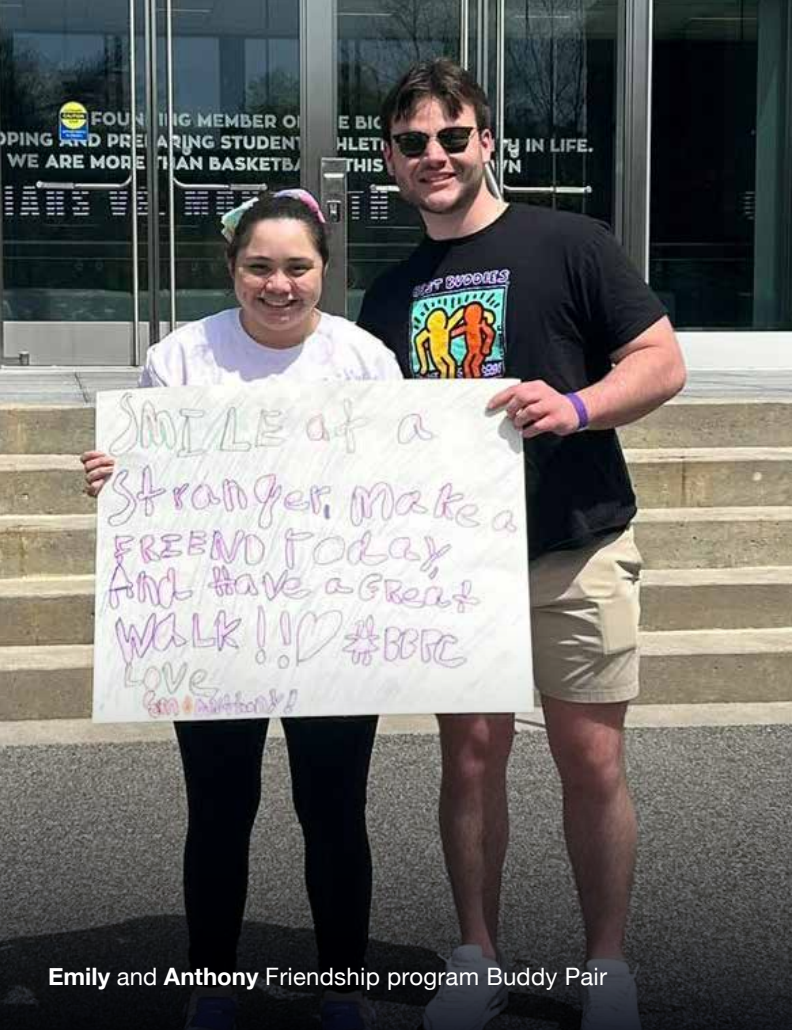

I began setting goals for myself and got involved in e-Buddies, the Ambassadors program, and the Jobs program.

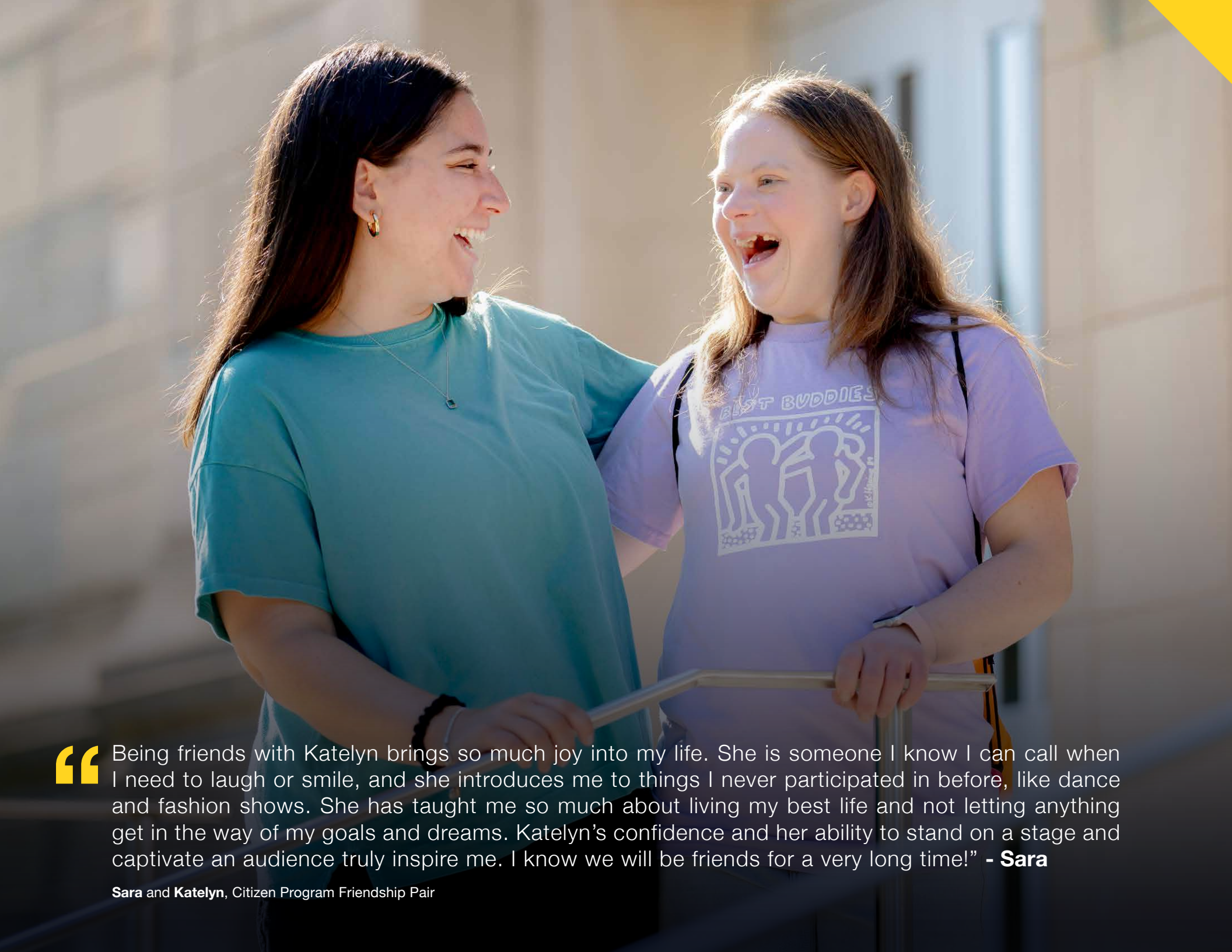

Michigan Year in Review

This past year has been full of incredible memories, community building and program growth for Best Buddies in Michigan. We are proud of the progress we've made in our state and can't wait for what 2025 will bring.

Our Friendship program has grown to 17 chapters, with three new additions in the high school space. We also added a new Citizens program chapter in Washtenaw County to complement our already existing chapter in Oakland county, and hope to bring more of these throughout Michigan. Andrews University is our latest addition to our college ranks, making nine schools pairing college students with individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). In 2025, we hope to surpass 25 chapters and reach areas of our state that we are not currently serving. In total, we are serving nearly 1,000 individuals through our Friendship program and have seen a 25 percent increase in total participants since the end of 2023. Additionally, we are proud of the work our Best Buddies Jobs program has done in the past year by making seven placements and currently serving 20 individuals with IDD. With recent approval to work with more counties in Michigan, we plan to make at least seven new placements in 2025 while expanding our employer partner base.



All of this is made possible by the generous support of our community. Participants, families, supporters and sponsors collectively have helped us grow our programming and impact more individuals this year than ever before. Our Best Buddies Friendship Walk at the Detroit Zoo saw more than 1000 registrants, a new Michigan record, and raised \$70,000 to support our mission in Michigan. We also had an amazing night at another Detroit landmark, the Henry Ford Museum, for our 2024 Champion of the Year Gala. More than 200 guests gathered for a memorable night celebrating our participants and raised more than \$152,000. Top Champion Alexis Fisher raised \$26,000 and took home the title of Champion of the Year!

We're deeply grateful for the incredible support we've received across our state and are excited to continue making an even greater impact. Thank you to our community, sponsors, volunteers, and donors—your dedication has truly changed lives.

The social connections she has made through Best Buddies created a sense of inclusion and belonging. It wasn't long before Alexis began participating in more events, including the Best Buddies Leadership Conference (BBLC), and Champion of the Year.

Alexis is thrilled with how much her life has transformed and the positive impact her job has had on her. "I have been more productive since getting a job and I enjoy having a place to go each day and being part of a team.

"At my job I have to stay focused and use customer service skills, organizational skills and time management. I have learned customer service skills and self-advocacy skills. I like staying busy at work and enjoy having my own money to spend," Alexis said.

Alexis looks forward to contributing to her team and having a sense of purpose.

As she looks ahead, Alexis has big plans for the future. "I would love to save enough money to get my own car one day."

Minnesota Year in Review

2024 was a year of impactful growth and program expansion for Best Buddies in Minnesota. Our one-to-one friendship and leadership development programs served over 2,200 people with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) across 116 cities and 24 counties in Minnesota. We opened 13 new school chapters, partnering with 40 schools in total, from elementary to college, to promote inclusion and belonging for all students. Additionally, our adult friendship program, called Best Buddies Citizens, grew to six different chapters across the state from Owatonna to the Twin Cities to Sherburne County. In total, 44 adults were matched in one-to-one friendships providing a lifeline of connection for those often left out.

In line with our mission to spread awareness about the importance of inclusion, our staff team trained 76 Ambassadors and student leaders to advocate for inclusion, hosted disabilities awareness trainings with several companies, and brought 20 student leaders, chapter advisors and Ambassadors to the annual Best Buddies Leadership Conference in Bloomington, Indiana.

The incredible support from our two signature events—the Best Buddies Friendship Walk and the Champion of the Year Gala—has been vital in helping Best Buddies Minnesota create opportunities for inclusion and leadership for individuals with and without IDD.

This spring, our Friendship Walk raised over \$110,000, bringing together nearly 800 walkers, 70 volunteers, and 16 generous sponsors. It was an inspiring day that proved: inclusion truly lives here in Minnesota.

In the fall, we hosted our 7th annual Champion of the Year Gala at Quincy Hall, which turned out to be our biggest event yet in both attendance and funds raised. Thanks to the generosity of 450 guests and the incredible efforts of nine Champion Candidates, we raised over \$360,000—making it the 6th highest-grossing Best Buddies gala in the nation!

On behalf of our Advisory Board and the staff at Best Buddies in Minnesota, I would like to thank our generous sponsors, dedicated volunteers, and selfless donors for your support.

Moving into 2025, we intend to build on this momentum to partner with more schools, empower our volunteers, grow our community-based programs, and engage more companies to spread awareness about the importance of inclusion. Thank you for being part of our success!

“Since joining Best Buddies and meeting Will, I’ve been having more fun and feeling more motivated than ever before,” Milan shared.

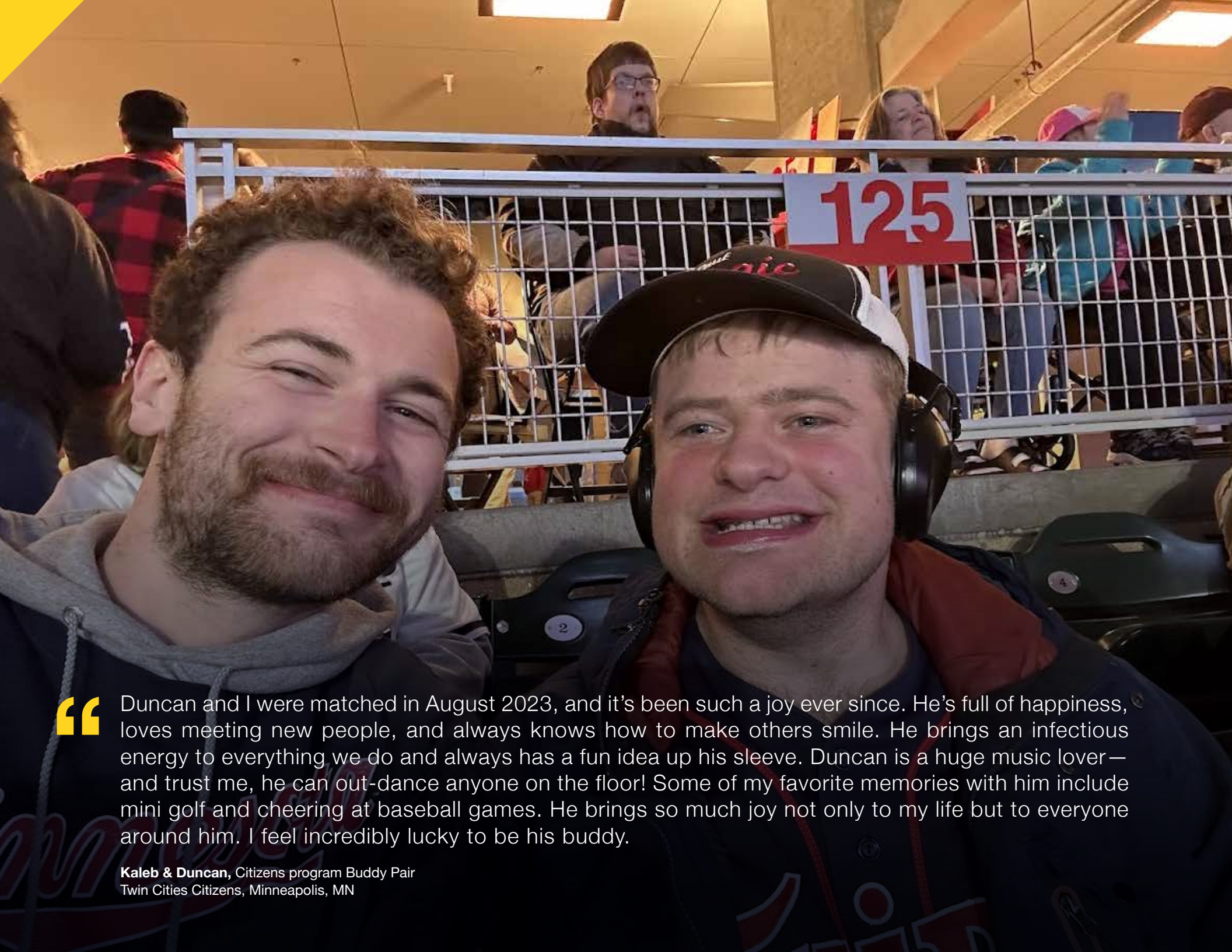

New Hampshire Year in Review

In 2024, Best Buddies in New Hampshire was excited to build on the momentum of 2023, focusing on expanding our programs, increasing one-to-one matches in the Citizens program, enhancing our Ambassador curriculum, and laying the groundwork for Pre-Employment Transition Services. I am happy to share that we successfully achieved these goals. We added new School Friendship programs, increasing our one-to-one friendship matches to 124 and bringing the total number of students in our programs to 1,040. In the Citizens program, we matched 16 participants (137 members in total), and we trained 15 Ambassadors who played a key role in multiple events throughout the year. One of our State Ambassadors, Katelyn McKivergan, made history as the first Ambassador from New Hampshire to deliver a speech at the closing ceremonies of the 2024 Best Buddies Leadership Conference—a moment of immense pride for all of us. Additionally, we collaborated to develop new Ambassador training sessions, which were well attended and well received. For example, one of our local business partners hosted an Ambassador training on social media, dedicating a full day to teaching best practices. We also took significant steps toward introducing Pre-Employment Transition Services in our state.

Our two annual Friendship Walks were a tremendous success! Together, they raised an impressive \$189,000 and welcomed over 1,000 attendees. This year marked the eleventh year of our Friendship Walk in Concord and the second year of our Walk in Exeter, both of which continue to grow each year. Seeing this incredible growth and community support is truly inspiring!

Our two Champion of the Year events were as magnificent as ever, creating lasting memories for all who attended. The Nashua Champion event featured 11 incredible Champions from across New Hampshire and raised over \$215,000. Meanwhile, our inaugural Party with a Purpose at the beautiful Wentworth by the Sea Country Club welcomed four Champions and raised \$40,000. Each night was filled with unforgettable moments and powerful showcases of our mission of inclusion.

As we step into 2025, we are filled with excitement for the future. We plan to build on the incredible momentum created by our dedicated volunteers, supporters, and donors. Our goals include expanding Friendship chapters across the state, increasing participant matches in the Citizens program, creating new growth opportunities for our Ambassadors, and continuing our efforts to bring Pre-Employment Transition Services—and ultimately, the Jobs program—to New Hampshire.

We strive to make a meaningful difference in our community and look forward to another year of growth and success in New Hampshire.

Emma tells Harrell, “You’re the reason I’m sad to leave high school!” Harrell reinforces those feelings calling Emma his best friend and encouraging individuals in New Hampshire and beyond to “join Best Buddies!”

New Mexico Year in Review

As we reflect on 2024, we are incredibly proud of all that we've accomplished in New Mexico with Best Buddies. From expanding our programs to connecting individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities to new friendships, jobs, and opportunities, this year has been a testament to the power of inclusion and community. We witnessed many inspiring moments of growth and support across our chapters, as well as increased awareness of the mission.

In 2024, Best Buddies in New Mexico supported 54 school-based chapters, which included six new chapters, and three Citizens chapters. The Jobs program worked with 66 participants, with 42 actively employed in integrated and competitive employment. In the Transitions program, Best Buddies in New Mexico served 142 Albuquerque Public Schools students across eight cohorts and delivered over 100 comprehensive Pre-Employment Transition Services workshops.

To support the continued growth of programs in New Mexico, we hosted two Friendship Walks—one in Albuquerque and a new site in Las Cruces. In Las Cruces, more than 200 supporters joined us for our inaugural Friendship Walk in the southern part of the state, where we raised close to \$10,000 to support our programs. Two weeks later in Albuquerque, we hosted the Friendship Walk, welcoming over 300 attendees and raising over \$45,000.

The New Mexico Champion of the Year Gala was an incredible event. We welcomed over 120 guests, cheered on six Champion of the Year candidates and their mission partners, and named Michelle Roybal as our 2024 Grand Champion. We are excited to continue the momentum of 2024 events as we enter 2025!

These incredible achievements highlight the dedication of our volunteers and supporters, but they also remind us of the ongoing need that still exists. As we continue our work across New Mexico, it's important to remember that fostering connection, a sense of belonging, and social inclusion are essential for building vibrant, healthy communities.

On behalf of our Advisory Board and the entire team in New Mexico, I want to express my deepest gratitude for your unwavering support of our mission to make friendship and inclusion a reality for all. Thanks to you, we reached remarkable milestones in 2024 that have paved the way for continued growth and success. We're excited for what 2025 holds and are grateful for your belief in the transformative power of inclusion!

New York Year in Review

In 2024, Best Buddies in New York focused on one key mission: expansion. From growing our programs to reaching new communities, we set out to make inclusion more accessible across the state, and we delivered. This year, we opened 29 new School Friendship chapters, strengthening connections and fostering meaningful relationships among students with and without IDD. Our Citizens program also saw tremendous growth, matching an additional 100 adults in one-to-one friendships, providing essential opportunities for socialization and inclusion. In response to the growing demand for skill-based programs, we continued expanding the Pre-Employment Transitions program, ensuring that more students with IDD received the career-readiness support they need to prepare for life after high school.

Our Best Buddies Jobs program also continued to secure integrated, competitive employment for adults with IDD, helping them achieve independence and financial stability. This year, we were proud to partner with new employers, including Citi Field and Manhattan Psychiatric Center, further expanding opportunities for inclusive hiring. The pipeline from Transitions to Jobs remains a critical pathway, ensuring that individuals with IDD have the resources and opportunities to build fulfilling careers.

Signature events once again proved to be powerful drivers of awareness and support. In 2024, our five Friendship Walks, including a brand-new Walk in Buffalo, welcomed more than 2,500 registrants statewide and raised an incredible \$378,792. The Champion of the Year galas in Albany and Rochester brought together 350 guests and raised \$140,000, with winners collectively raising more than \$20,000. Meanwhile, NYC's Party for a Purpose at Hearst Tower welcomed 250 guests and raised an impressive \$400,000. Lastly, the TCS NYC Marathon team grew to 17 runners, collectively raising \$97,857 to fund our mission.

Looking ahead, Best Buddies New York is eager to build on this momentum. In 2025, we hope to expand programming to include Best Buddies' newest pillar: Family Support. With the unwavering support of our community, we are confident in our ability to create even greater opportunities for inclusion. Together, we will continue to foster a world where everyone, regardless of ability, is valued, celebrated, and given the opportunities they deserve.

Having a job has definitely made my life better—I can pay for things I enjoy, like The New York Times and Peacock TV, and I can buy gifts for my friends and family. In the next five years, I hope to go full-time, grow in the museum field, and eventually have my own place.

North Carolina Year in Review

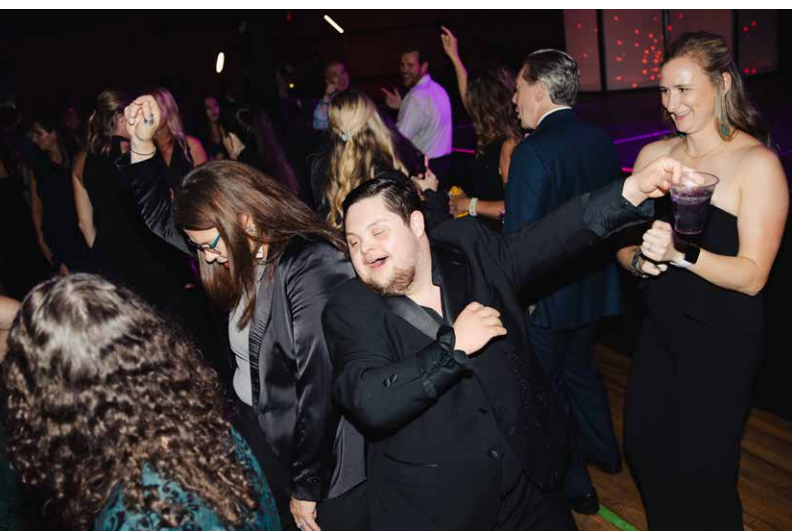
As Best Buddies in North Carolina reflects on our accomplishments in 2024, we are deeply grateful for the generous support of our donors, sponsors, volunteers, and advocates. Your contributions have been vital to our growth and success throughout the state.

This year, we celebrated significant growth within our team, which opened the door to new and enhanced programs. I stepped into the role of State Director, joined by two new Employment Consultants, Marisa Bowles and Spencer Setcavage, along with Transitions Manager Louise Kelley. We also welcomed Ally Adams as our new Development Coordinator and proudly promoted Erin Vermillion to Lead Program Manager and Kelsey Warlick to Director of Jobs and Transitions.



A highlight of our year was launching the Transition Program, which has allowed our community and employer partners to invest in our students more meaningfully, broadening our overall impact. This fall, we partnered with three schools, launched six cohorts, and successfully engaged 48 students in a comprehensive 10-week program. Participants benefited from two tailored tracks—self-advocacy mentoring and job exploration/workplace readiness—integrating hands-on activities that emphasized community engagement. We are incredibly excited to see how this program will grow in 2025 with the support of our community, sponsors, and state partners.

Our two key signature events, which greatly impacted our efforts in North Carolina, were the Best Buddies Friendship Walks in Charlotte and Raleigh and the Champion of the Year Gala. This year's Friendship Walks were a tremendous success, with over 1,000 participants joining us to promote inclusive friendships and raise awareness. Together, we raised nearly \$90,000, attracting numerous new school and community teams eager to support our cause. Additionally, our Champion of the Year Gala celebrated its 9th year! Thanks to the dedication of our amazing Champions, Mission Partners, sponsors, and guests, we raised over \$220,000 to support our North Carolina programs. This achievement not only highlights the power of community but also inspires us to continue our work with renewed energy.

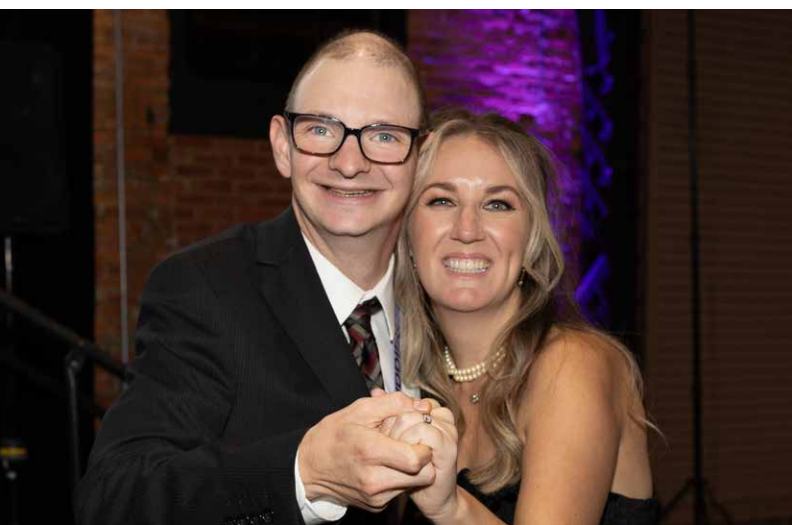

Ohio



Ohio Year in Review

2024 was another year of tremendous growth and increased engagement for Best Buddies in Ohio. We opened Best Buddies Friendship chapters in 20 schools across the state and now have 55 Best Buddies Citizens matches statewide. We also launched a school-based program featuring 20 hours of curriculum focused on leadership development and job readiness. More than 100 students from our Best Buddies Friendship chapters participated in these sessions. Across all programs, we served more than 2,000 individuals in 36 cities and 21 counties throughout Ohio. We also hired two new team members, bringing our total to seven full-time staff and expanding our presence with offices in Cleveland, Columbus, and Cincinnati.

The Best Buddies Friendship Walk was, once again, our most well-attended event since launching programs in Ohio! Attendance grew from 800 participants in 2023 to more than 1,300 in 2024, as people came together in Cleveland, Columbus, and Cincinnati to walk for inclusion. Participants, families, and businesses united to raise \$140,000 across all three events. We extend a special thank you to our event chairs: Jenna Chilinski and Eric Simon (Cleveland), Renee Stein (Columbus), and Kate Malo and Connie Mehlman (Cincinnati).

Community leaders also championed inclusion through our Champion of the Year Galas in Cleveland and Columbus. Fifteen community leaders competed for the title of Grand Champion of the Year, raising an impressive \$289,000. The generosity of our donors laid a strong foundation for the continued success of our friendship and leadership programs, propelling us toward our expanding goals. Congratulations to our Grand Champions: Sue LeDonne Girardi and Julie Panzera in Columbus, and Jackie Wise in Cleveland.

All of us at Best Buddies in Ohio extend our deepest appreciation to our incredible participants, families, volunteers, donors, and corporate sponsors for a successful 2024. Your support and commitment to our mission continue to drive the growth of our programs and create more inclusive communities throughout the state. We are excited to build on this momentum in 2025!

Mikey makes sure to attend events that are important to me—especially my musicals, which I believe he has been to nearly ten off!”

True friendship isn’t the only thing they found in Best Buddies—both Mikey and Avery gained many additional benefits from their participation. Mikey shares, “Being a part of Best Buddies has taught me how to be more independent and confident. Through my trusting relationship with Avery, I have learned how to be a good friend by following her genuine example. Best Buddies has enriched Avery’s life in other meaningful ways as well. Through my friendship with Mikey, I’ve learned what attributes I should look for in a friend and how to be there for a friend no matter what.”

Oregon Year in Review

Every day, hundreds of individuals with disabilities spend hours alone, wishing they had a friend or someone to talk to. Others have friends but don't have a job or steady income. Best Buddies in Oregon is on a mission to change that. With a growing community of supporters across the state, we believe we can end the isolation experienced by individuals living with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

Thanks to the generous support of the M.J. Murdock Charitable Trust and the JTMF Foundation, Best Buddies Oregon hired two full-time staff members in 2024. With the addition of an Area Director and a Lead Program Manager, we significantly expanded our statewide outreach and friendship programming. Throughout the year, our school friendship program operated in 13 schools, including 1 elementary school, 2 middle schools, 7 high schools, and 3 colleges—serving a combined 250 members. Our adult friendship program, Citizens, established two community chapters and served 38 members.

Leadership development trainings educated and empowered people from Oregon—with and without IDD—to become leaders, public speakers, and advocates. Our program participants led efforts within our communities and across the country to build a more inclusive world for people with IDD.

Our community of passionate supporters, fundraisers, influencers, and partners continues to inspire us with their commitment to our mission. In May 2024, more than 250 people gathered at the Friendship Walk, promoting inclusion and raising over \$13,000 for Best Buddies Oregon.

In the fall of 2024, supporters and participants from across the state came together for Oregon's 4th annual Best Buddies Champion of the Year Gala. We celebrated the night with 200 attendees as community sponsors, volunteers, and advocates raised over \$107,000.

The year 2025 promises to be one of growth and excitement for Best Buddies Oregon. We will continue to expand our school and community-based friendship programs, provide leadership training, and work toward ending the social, physical, and economic isolation of people with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

When she grows up, Addilyn wants to work with children with disabilities and help create a world where everyone feels included and valued—just like in the Life Skills classroom.



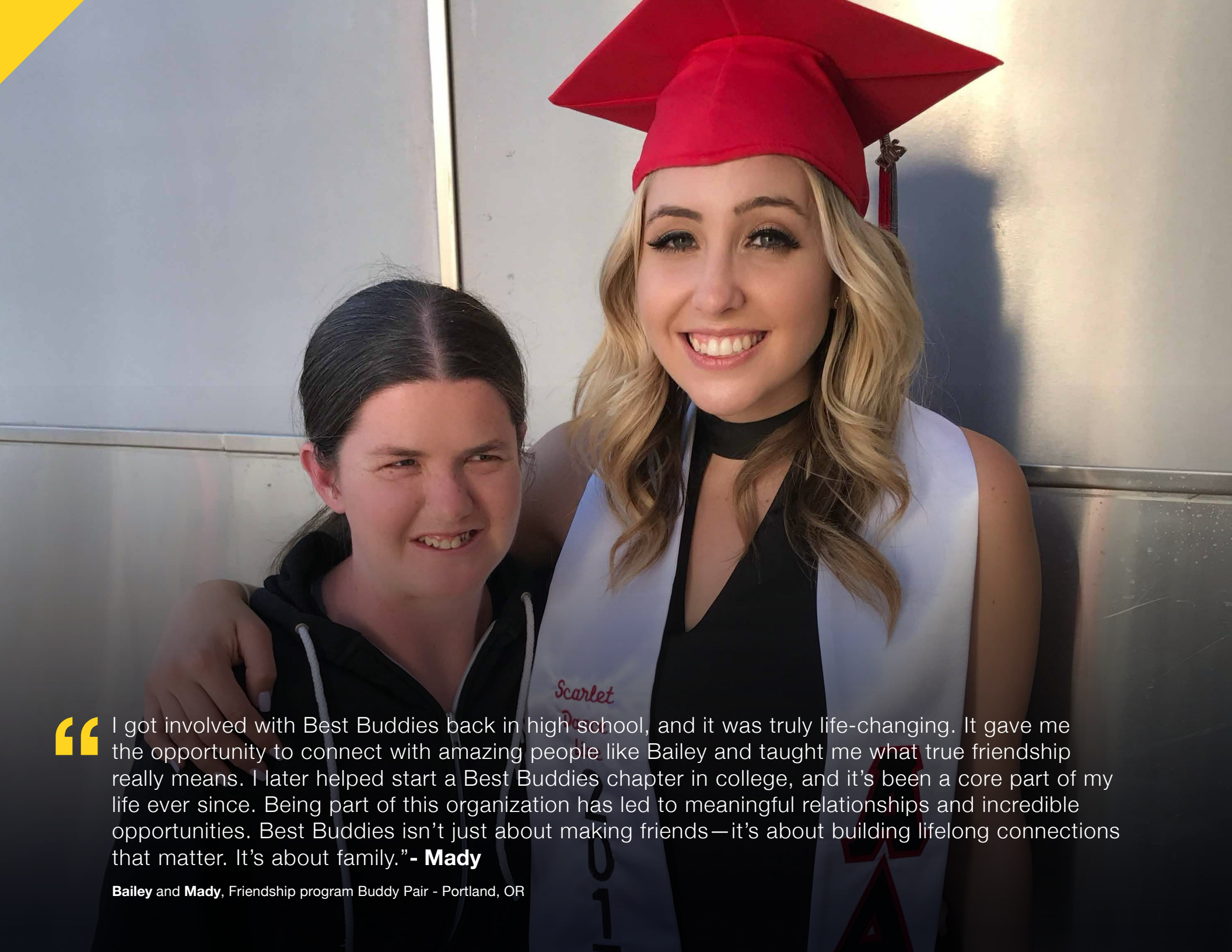

Pennsylvania Year in Review

The year 2024 was truly a milestone year for Best Buddies in Pennsylvania as we celebrated the 30th anniversary of our mission to foster inclusion, friendship, and opportunity across the Commonwealth. With our commitment to growth, we expanded to 158 school friendship chapters, including 29 elementary schools, 42 middle schools, 60 high schools, and 28 colleges. This growth added 1,750 new members this year alone, allowing us to connect even more individuals with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). One of our proudest achievements was launching the Best Buddies Living Program at State College. This new initiative fosters an inclusive, integrated environment where individuals with and without IDD live, learn, and thrive together, and it has already become a cornerstone of our efforts.

This year, our signature events broke records and brought communities together like never before. The Best Buddies Friendship Walks (BBFW) in Pittsburgh and Philadelphia welcomed more than 2,500 walkers, uniting supporters and raising an impressive \$250,000 for our programs. The Philadelphia Walk returned to the crowd-favorite, King of Prussia Mall, drawing record attendance and showcasing the region's enthusiasm for inclusion.

Pittsburgh's annual TasteBuds event, which has been a beloved tradition for almost a decade, celebrated its continued success with a sold-out crowd of 1,000 guests and featured 35 talented chefs paired with sous-chefs with IDD. This extraordinary evening raised a record-breaking \$380,000 to directly support programs in Western Pennsylvania. At the Best Buddies Staff Leadership Conference, TasteBuds received national recognition, earning the inaugural Impact Award for its dedication to mission-driven excellence, creativity, and consistent growth over the years.

As we look ahead, we are excited to build on the successes of this year, strengthening our programs, expanding our reach, and fostering more opportunities for individuals with IDD to live, work, and thrive inclusively. Thank you for being part of our journey and for making 2024 a year to remember. Together, we will continue to create a more inclusive future for all.

South Carolina Year in Review

In 2024, Best Buddies in New Jersey set ambitious goals to expand our reach and deepen our impact across the state. We aimed to increase participation in our core programs: one-to-one friendships, integrated employment, leadership development, and inclusive living for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Through concerted efforts, we successfully launched new chapters in several schools and communities, resulting in a 15% growth in membership. Our Jobs program placed nine individuals in competitive employment positions, and our Transitions program serviced over 50 participants across New Jersey. We successfully partnered with our first Project Search site at Novo Nordisk, where three interns spent the school year gaining job experience and receiving hands-on training through various internship rotations across Novo Nordisk's campus. Additionally, over 25 participants benefited from our leadership development workshops, empowering them to advocate for inclusion within their communities.

A significant milestone in 2024 was the launch of Best Buddies Living in New Brunswick, NJ. This program provides inclusive housing opportunities where individuals with and without IDD can live together in a supportive environment, promoting independence and social integration. The establishment of this new pillar reflects our ongoing commitment to fostering inclusion beyond schools and workplaces, ensuring people with IDD have access to a fulfilling and independent life.

The Best Buddies Friendship Walk is the leading walk in the country supporting inclusion for people with IDD. In 2024, New Jersey hosted two Friendship Walks across the state: on April 23 at Bergen Community College in Paramus and on April 29 at The College of New Jersey in Ewing Township. These events collectively attracted over 1,000 participants and raised more than \$70,000. The walks featured family-friendly activities, live entertainment, and opportunities for participants to connect, fostering a sense of community and shared purpose.

On November 15, 2024, we celebrated our annual Champion of the Year Gala at The Grand in Totowa, NJ. This event is a competitive fundraising campaign that honors local leaders who champion inclusion. The gala brought together over 300 attendees and raised a total of \$100,000. We are proud to announce that Kristen Beriloff was named New Jersey's Champion of the Year, raising \$23,267 for Best Buddies.

As we reflect on 2024, we are inspired by the strides we've made toward a more inclusive New Jersey. Looking ahead, our goals for 2025 include expanding our school-based programs, increasing employer partnerships for our Jobs program, and enhancing our virtual engagement platforms to reach even more individuals. Additionally, we aim to further develop our Best Buddies Living program in New Brunswick and explore opportunities to expand it to other parts of the state. We remain committed to our mission and are excited to continue building a world where everyone feels included and valued.

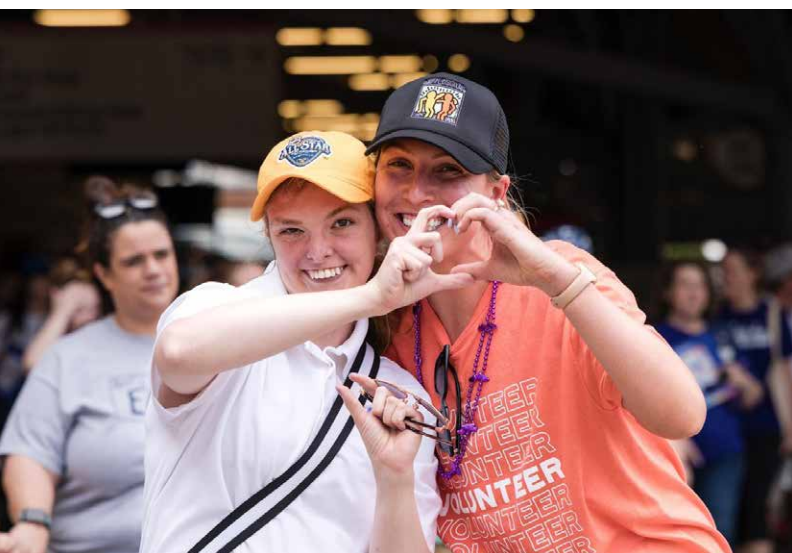

Tennessee Year in Review

In 2024, Best Buddies in Tennessee took significant strides on our path to inclusion. Beyond sustaining our core programs, our team prioritized statewide growth with a simple goal: to ensure that more Tennesseans with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) have opportunities—for friendship, gainful employment, leadership development, inclusive living, and family support.

Our first step toward achieving this goal was investing in our team. After a successful 2023, we were able to hire a Program Manager in Memphis to support our programs across West Tennessee. This marked the first programmatic hire in that area since 2018, and we saw immediate results through more engaged school chapters and a strengthened Citizens program. This success was mirrored in our signature events; led by school chapters and corporate partners, the Memphis Friendship Walk reached new heights in both participation and fundraising. In the fall, we were especially proud to host our first Champion of the Year Gala in Memphis, which was a resoundingly positive engagement. In addition to achieving 150% of our revenue goal, the event brought the broader community together, celebrated our Champions, and established a pipeline of support for the future.

Other major programmatic advancements for our state came in the form of two brand-new initiatives—Eunie’s Buddies and Inclusive Living. We were honored to pilot Eunie’s Buddies under the newly established Family Support pillar, with a goal of assisting families in finding community and navigating the journey of raising a child with an IDD. We celebrated the launch of this program by hosting the Best Buddies Celebrating Mothers event at Southall Farm & Inn, where we were thrilled to recognize Tennessee’s own Ellen Boyer as the Best Buddies International Mother of the Year.

This event served as a significant catalyst for our state. Not only did it lay the foundation for hiring a strong Deputy Director to oversee Eunie’s Buddies, but it also fueled conversations around bringing Inclusive Living to Nashville. Just three months later, we secured a lease with Signature Music Row in the heart of Nashville, neighboring Vanderbilt University. In November, our first residents officially moved in, and we are excited to help Tennesseans achieve their goal of living independently.

Our fundraising successes in Middle Tennessee continued to serve as the foundation on which these programmatic developments were built. In the spring, we moved our Friendship Walk to First Horizon Park and received a national prize from AlphaGraphics to support the event. That same spring, we also facilitated a national partnership with SkyZone and received our first-ever funding from the State of Tennessee, before hosting a record-breaking Champion of the Year Gala in the fall. We were immensely proud to have Anthony Kennedy Shriver in the room with us as we celebrated our Nashville Champions and raised \$700,000 for our programs led by the top Champion nationwide, Nathan Dean, whose campaign accounted for more than \$360,000 of that total. We capped off the year by winning the State Showdown end-of-year giving campaign for the second year in a row, earning a match to further support our efforts.

In 2025, we are well-positioned and poised to build on this momentum. Our team has never been more engaged or motivated to serve our constituents and to reach even more!

Texas Year in Review

In 2024, Best Buddies in Texas rolled up our sleeves and dug deep into our mission and footprint across the state. With our staff expanding from 16 to 21 at the end of 2023, we closed out 2024 with 135 school chapters from elementary through college serving 5,518 participants and impacting more than 55,000 people across 61 cities and 24 counties throughout the great state of Texas!

Our Citizens (Adult Friendship) program, now in its second year, boasts 232 participants statewide, with an additional 227 participating in e-Buddies.

Our Jobs program worked with 65 participants this year, placing 49 in meaningful employment. We also launched our long-awaited Pre-Employment Transition Services program, bridging our Friendship and Jobs Programs. The social skills gained through our Friendship and Leadership Programs naturally lead into our participants' desire for careers—just like their peers. This new program provides critical opportunities for career exploration, soft skills development, and work observation—key to not only securing, but also maintaining meaningful employment.

Our two Best Buddies Global Ambassadors completed their two years of active service and now remain Global Ambassadors for life. We held nearly 400 group activities and provided Ambassador and Leadership training to more than 300 high school students across the state.

Spring Friendship Walks across the state celebrated the end of the school year with 2,400 registered participants and 250 teams—more than double our 2023 numbers—raising a total of \$232,700.

Ninety-one delegates proudly represented Texas at our global Best Buddies Leadership Conference at Indiana University in July. This group included Board members and community leaders, several of whom presented on panels and workshops.

With great glitz and glamour, our Champion of the Year Galas were a resounding success! Engaging 20 Champions and Mission Partners statewide, we collectively raised \$673,000. With exciting themes like “Wild About Inclusion,” “Inclusion City Limits,” and “Studio 89,” nearly 1,000 guests came together to celebrate and support our mission of inclusion for people of all abilities.

Thanks to the incredible growth we experienced this year, Best Buddies in Texas is poised to make an even greater impact in 2025. We are truly grateful for the individuals, foundations, and corporations dedicated to improving the lives of people of all abilities.

In December 2022, Jessica received her second warning when she talked about the history of the Holocaust with a visitor and misunderstood their interest. Following a complaint being filed she was put on probation. Jessica became very anxious and expressed her concern about possibly losing her job. "I love this job, I was meant for this place, I know so much, and I just want to share it."

Jessica's supervisor noticed Jessica was feeling distant at work due to her worries. She encouraged Jessica to apply for a position as a backup concierge. With help from her JPS and management, Jessica decided to apply for the concierge role. This was a big challenge for her since she would have to handle both her visitor services job and the new concierge position if she was accepted.

Supervisor Apolinar Abonza says, "Jessica is a valuable member of our team. She brings a unique and enjoyable perspective to her work, possessing extensive knowledge about various exhibits. Jessica confidently engages with customers, always greeting them with a warm smile. Her expertise and contributions have significantly enhanced our team's performance."

Thanks to her knowledge and love for history, Jessica successfully became the backup concierge while still keeping her visitor services role. Now, she happily works at the museum, making her new role her own.

Utah Year in Review

The year 2024 has been marked by meaningful friendships, impactful events, increased expansion and awareness, and new connections that have enriched the lives of individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Best Buddies in Utah continues to grow and foster more inclusive communities each year.

Our Friendship program, active in 15 schools across Utah, reached over 1,000 youth, with more than 200 one-to-one friendship matches. The Citizens program, our adult friendship initiative, supported 60 members with 15 one-to-one friendship matches. This year, we spent time with our local community partners who see the value in ending the isolation of individuals living with IDD—building chapter kits for all of our school chapters. These kits included supplies and materials such as notebooks, pens, snacks, activities, markers, sensory materials, and more! The Leadership Development program provided training for new and returning ambassadors, helping them gain self-advocacy skills and the confidence to lead happy, fulfilling lives.

Best Buddies Utah held one incredible signature event in 2024: the Friendship Walk. This event has been critical to our mission of providing a lifetime of inclusion for people with IDD. In the spring, our Friendship Walk raised over \$25,000, with more than 200 participants coming together to celebrate. Nellie Southam, along with her buddy Jane and Murray High School, raised over \$800 to earn the Top School Award.

We ended the year by hosting our 2nd Annual Friendship Ball in partnership with MOXIE at an ice rink. As we closed out 2024 and reflected on everything we're thankful for, program participants, families, and staff enjoyed ice skating, warm cookies, and hot cocoa.

On behalf of our Advisory Board and the staff at Best Buddies, I would like to thank our sponsors, volunteers, and donors for your continued support. As we leap into 2025, we're excited to build on this momentum and see what the new year brings.

Washington Year in Review

2024 was a productive year for Best Buddies in Washington as they worked tirelessly to create a more inclusive state for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). The goals for the year focused on expanding awareness, increasing participation, and fostering meaningful friendships. Through strategic partnerships, community engagement, and tireless efforts from volunteers and supporters, Best Buddies in Washington continued to grow the mission in the state. They opened three new friendship chapters and were able to serve 400 individuals with IDD in our friendship programs.

Along with our one-to-one friendship programs, Best Buddies in Washington focused on deepening its impact through the Jobs program. They secured employment for four participants in the community and made new relationships with future employers. These accomplishments represent a significant step forward for the state as they continue to build a more inclusive society where everyone can thrive.



The Friendship Walk was a standout event, bringing the community together in celebration of inclusion. Held at Cougar Mountain Zoo, the walk attracted over 300 participants from across the state, all walking in support of people with IDD. The event was a success, raising a total of \$61,000, which will directly support Best Buddies programs throughout Washington. The walk featured a variety of activities for all ages, including access to the zoo, music, and speeches from community leaders and participants who shared their inspiring stories. This event not only raised funds but also amplified the message of friendship and opportunity for all.

The *Champion of the Year Gala* was another tremendous success, celebrating individuals and organizations that have demonstrated exceptional leadership in promoting inclusion. The event took place at The Lotte Hotel and attracted over 200 guests, including philanthropists, business leaders, and supporters of the Best Buddies mission. The event raised \$124,000 through silent and live auctions, donations, and corporate sponsorships. The highlight of the evening was recognizing the Grand Champion duo who have made a significant impact in the lives of individuals with IDD, demonstrating that leadership can come in many forms.

Looking ahead, Best Buddies in Washington is excited to continue its momentum into 2025. Future goals include expanding the Jobs program, increasing the number of school chapters, and launching new initiatives, like the Transitions program, that create even more opportunities for individuals with IDD. Together, we are building a world where everyone has the opportunity to belong, succeed, and thrive.

Even though Avery is nonverbal, she always has so much to share and never fails to make Kate laugh. Avery’s joyful spirit and energy always manage to brighten Kate’s day.

What a year it's been for Best Buddies in Wisconsin! In 2024, we took inclusion to new heights—expanding our reach, creating life-changing opportunities, and celebrating incredible achievements. With growing chapters, thriving jobs programs, and passionate volunteers, we made a lasting impact across the state.

We touched the lives of over 3,000 students with and without intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD) in 67 schools—and we did not stop there! We proudly launched three new school chapters, extending our mission of friendship and inclusion even further.

Our Jobs program continued to flourish, supporting 60 participants in building meaningful careers. We successfully placed 43 individuals with IDD into fulfilling jobs, helping them gain independence and confidence in the workplace.

In 2024, the Best Buddies Leadership Conference was nothing short of inspiring! Best Buddies Wisconsin brought 35 enthusiastic students who gained essential leadership skills, learned how to run successful chapters, and connected with peers to create even more inclusive communities.

Our annual Friendship Walk was held in May at Wisconsin Brewing Company Park, home of the Lake Country DockHounds. It was our biggest walk yet! With over 1,200 of our closest friends, we crushed our fundraising goal, raising over \$98,000 and exceeding expectations by \$5,000! With 80 registered teams, including schools from across the state, this event was a true celebration of inclusion.

Our sold-out Golf Outing at Ironwood Golf Course was a huge success. With a full course, we had golfers hitting the greens and raising over \$51,000! From exciting on-course games to fantastic raffles, prizes, and a lively post-event gathering, fun was had by all.

Our final event of the year, Champion of the Year at The Pfister Hotel in Milwaukee, was a night to remember! With 300 guests and seven inspiring Champions, we raised over \$194,000 to further our mission, all thanks to our generous sponsors, dedicated supporters, and incredible volunteers.

None of this would be possible without our amazing staff, volunteers, teachers, and board members who work tirelessly to make inclusion a reality every day. As we look ahead, we're setting our sights on even bigger goals and serving more individuals in the community.
